Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907.

BY an Order dated the 18th day of August, 1932, the Ministry of Health has declared that on and after the 1st day of September, 1932, the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the contributory places of East Saltney, Hawarden, Hawarden Special Drainage District, Higher Kinnerton, Hope, Llanfynydd and Sealand within the Rural District of Hawarden, viz.:—

Section 27 (which relates to temporary buildings) subject however to the provisions of Section 33 (which relates to the exemption of certain buildings).

dition that the following words shall be added to and form part of the Section, that is to say:—

"Nothing in this Section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force.
