CHILDREN AND YOUNG PERSONS ACT,

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that on the 21st instant he made the "Children and Young Persons Act, 1932 (Date of Commencement) Order (No. 1) 1932" under section 90 (3) of the Children and Young Persons Act, 1932. The Order provides that sections 64 and 79 of the Act shall come into operation on the 1st November, 1932, and that Part V (Infant Life Protection) of the Act shall come into operation on the 1st January, 1933.
