(c) In pursuance of their said powers the said Committee hereby order that except as in this Order provided, no benefit or advantage shall be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash.

## THE APPLE CAPSID (ESSEX) ORDER OF 1932.

The Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the above Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927.

The Order is operative only within a district comprising the administrative county of Essex, the county boroughs of East Ham, Southend and West Ham, and the boroughs of Colchester, Ilford, Leyton and Walthamstow.

The Order provides that any person other than a private grower as defined in the Order who receives within the district any apple trees or gooseberry or currant bushes for planting or for sale for planting must notify the fact to the Local Authority within fourteen days from the date of receipt.

An officer appointed by the Local Authority may enter any premises in the district and examine any apple trees or gooseberry or currant bushes, and the Local Authority, on being satisfied that the Apple Capsid exists on any such trees or bushes, may serve upon the occupier of the premises a Notice requiring him to treat the trees or bushes in such manner as may be prescribed in the Notice.

Penalties are provided for (1) failure to notify the receipt of apple trees or gooseberry or currant bushes, or (2) failure to comply with a Notice served under the Order, or (3) failure to give the appointed officer reasonable facilities as required by the Order, or (4) wilfully obstructing or impeding the appointed officer in the exercise of his powers under the Order.

The provisions of the Order, which comes into operation on the 1st November, 1932, are to be enforced by the Local Authority, which may appoint for the purposes of the Order such persons as it thinks fit.
