MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT: THE NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL. ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

WHEREAS in pursuance of Section 46 (1) of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, the Norfolk County Council have made application to the Minister of Transport for an Order to be made by him, the effect of which is:

To prohibit or restrict subject to such exceptions or conditions as to occasional user or otherwise as may be specified in the Order, the driving of heavy and light locomotives, motor tractors, heavy motor cars (as defined respectively by Section 2 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930), and motor cars with a seating capacity exceeding fourteen persons exclusive of the driver and any motor car or other mechanically propelled vehicle the weight of which, when unladen, exceeds two tons, on so much of the road along Blakeney Quay as lies between the point where the Quay Road joins the High Street and extends westward along the Quayside for a distance of 475 feet from the aforementioned point, in the Parish of Blakeney in the Rural District of Walsingham.

- . Provided that nothing in the Order shall prevent the driving upon the said road of
  - (i) any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said road.
  - (ii) any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said road, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said road, of any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports.

(Extension of existing pavilion authorised by Torquay Harbour Order 1910; Provision of winter garden and assembly or neading rooms; application of powers of Order of 1910; borrowing powers; Incorporation amendment and repeal of Acts; and other purposes.)

OTICE is hereby given that in pursuance of the provisions of the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861, and the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861 Amendment Act, application is intended to be made to the Ministry of Transport on or before the 23rd day of December next by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Torquay in the County of Devon (hereinafter called "the Corporation") for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order") for all or some of the following among other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To empower the Corporation to extend in an easterly direction on land belonging to them the existing pavilion erected by them in pursuance of the powers of the Torquay Harbour Order 1910 (hereinafter called "the Order of 1910") and known as the Pavilion.

2. To empower the Corporation to erect a winter garden and assembly or reading rooms on land belonging to them and lying to the east and south of and adjoining the said existing pavilion and the land on which such pavilion is proposed to be extended.

3. The works described in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this notice will be situate in the Borough and Parish of Torquay in the County of Devon.

4. To apply the powers of the Order of 1910 with respect to the maintenance furnishing and equipment of the charging of admission to and the letting and leasing of the said existing pavilion, to the said pavilion as extended and to the said winter garden and assembly or reading rooms.

5. To make provision as to the application of money received by the Corporation in respect of the said pavilion as so extended and in respect of the said winter garden and

assembly or reading rooms.

6. To authorise the Corporation to borrow money for all or any of the purposes of the Order and to charge the moneys so borrowed on the general rate fund and general rate of the borough and to provide for the repayment of the said moneys.

7. To make all such other provisions as may be necessary or expedient for the purpose of
