

the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bittadon, now vested in him, the said Edgar Hay Hay as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of the College of the Great Hall of the University, commonly called University College, Oxford, on the 29th day of November, 1932, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

Ex Parte the Master and Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University, commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE to amend the Ordinance in relation to the Fellowship of the Foundation of Robert Mynors, Esquire, made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5. ch. 33), for the aforesaid College, and forming Appendix III of University College Statutes, duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting specially summoned for this purpose and holden on the seventeenth day of March, 1932, and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and ordered for sealing after the consent of the

University had been given on the ninth day of May, 1932 (*Oxford University Gazette*, Vol. LXII, No. 2001, page 510), and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Ordinance in relation to the Fellowship of the Foundation of Robert Mynors, Esquire, in order to make clear that the College retains the right at the conclusion of each period of tenure of, and at each new appointment to, the Mynors Fellowship when held in conjunction with a University Readership, to decide for its part whether or not the connection of the Fellowship with a University Readership shall be continued for the next Mynors Fellowship period, and to elucidate the distinction between the duties of such Mynors Fellow as University Reader and as Fellow of the College, and to protect the status and rights of the present holder of the Fellowship;

Now, therefore, WE, the Master and Fellows of the said College, in virtue of all and every the powers enabling us contained in Statute XIII. 1 of our Statutes and section 7 (2) of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do alter and amend the said Ordinance by the following omissions, alterations and additions:

WE substitute for the present clauses 5-7 inclusive, the following new clauses, numbered 5, 6, 7, and we add a new clause 9, viz.:

5. The Mynors Fellowship may, if the Master and Fellows at a General Meeting so decide, be tenable in conjunction with a University Readership in Economics or Politics, if the University shall maintain such a Readership with a stipend of not less than £300 per annum, for this purpose: and in this case the Mynors Fellow shall be elected, or re-elected, by a Board consisting of the Master of the College, the Drummond Professor of Political Economy, the Gladstone Professor of Political Theory and Institutions, a person appointed by the Hebdomadal Council, a person appointed by the Faculty of Social Studies, and two persons appointed by the Master and Fellows of the College. The Fellow so elected shall in the first instance be elected for such period, not exceeding seven years, as shall have been agreed upon between the College and the University. At the end of such period, or if the Fellow shall previously vacate the Readership, the Master and Fellows shall at a General Meeting decide whether the connection of the Fellowship with the University Readership shall be continued for a further period, and if it be so continued the then holder shall be re-eligible by the said Board.

6. If the University shall determine the Readership or the tenure of the same by the Mynors Fellow or if the College shall decide under cl. 5 of this Ordinance not to continue the connection of the Fellowship with the University Readership, the then holder of the Mynors Fellowship shall be re-eligible by the Master and Fellows under cl. 2 of this Ordinance.

7. A Mynors Fellow elected under cl. 5 of this Ordinance shall, as to his duties as University Reader, be subject to such Regulations as may from time to time be determined by Statute made by or for the University and to any Regulations made for the Reader by the University after consultation with the College, and, as to his duties as Fellow, be subject to
