The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of January, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Foxton and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Gumley, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of Leicester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Foxton and Gumley duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Leicester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for

effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Leicester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Foxton and Gumley are now full, the Reverend William Tristram Edward Cary being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Foxton and the Reverend James Arthur Herbert Bell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Gumley:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cyril, Bishop of Leicester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Foxton and the said Benefice of Gumley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Foxton with Gumley,’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be

vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Foxton only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith, if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Gumley and the then Incumbent of Foxton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Gumley only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Foxton and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Foxton if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Gumley shall have been instituted to Gumley subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Gumley before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Gumley following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Foxton and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Foxton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Foxton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Gumley and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Gumley shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Foxton shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under

the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Leicester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by W. J. Walker on behalf of himself and other Parishioners of the Parish of Gumley, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 17th March, 1932:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said appeal into consideration reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be affirmed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council by Order of the 10th day of November, 1932, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Leicester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, duly prepared, and

laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of November, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Thwing, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York, between that Benefice and a certain other Benefice, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sculcoates, which said last named Benefice is also situate in the said County of York and in the said Diocese of York:

“Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Thwing and Sculcoates is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being:

“And whereas the present endowments of the said Benefice of Thwing include the sum of £20,824 0s. 8d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum stock held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for and for the benefit of the Rector for the time being of the said Benefice of Thwing and as part of the endowments of such Benefice:

“And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said Benefice of Sculcoates is at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said Benefice of Thwing has endowments of such an amount as that after the transfer of endowments hereinafter recommended and proposed shall have been made the said Benefice of Thwing will still be sufficiently endowed:

“And whereas the Right Honourable John, Viscount Sankey, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the Cure of Souls within the Parish of Sculcoates aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Thwing which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“And whereas the said Benefice of Thwing is now full, the Reverend Canon Arthur Edward Smallwood being the Rector or Incumbent thereof:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, acting as Bishop of the Diocese within which each of the said two Benefices is situate (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), and with the consent of the said John, Viscount Sankey, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the Patron of each of the said two Benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, as from the day of the date

at which the said Benefice of Thwing shall from whatsoever cause be next avoided or from the date of the cessation of any charge placed upon the revenues of the said Benefice under the Clergy Pensions Measures, 1926 to 1928, in consequence of the retirement from the said Benefice of the said Arthur Edward Smallwood the sum of £3,333 6s. 8d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, being part of the aforesaid sum of £20,824 0s. 8d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, shall cease to form part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Thwing and shall be held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for and for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Sculcoates and as part of the endowments of that Benefice.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Lord Bishop of Winchester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

“We, Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

“There is in the County of Hants and our Diocese of Winchester the Rectory or Benefice of Tadley the Parish whereof contains a population of one thousand two hundred or thereabouts (according to the Census of 1921) with accommodation in the Parish Church for one hundred and twenty persons and there is also within the Parish of Tadley situated in the District known as Heath End the Church of St. Mary with accommodation for one hundred and twenty persons and which Church is situated at a distance of one mile from the

Parish Church of Tadley and two miles from the Parsonage House of the same Parish.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Tadley is four hundred and thirty pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Baughurst the Parish whereof contains a population of four hundred and eighty three or thereabouts (according to the Census of 1921) with accommodation in the Parish Church for two hundred and fifty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Baughurst is three hundred and eighty five pounds or thereabouts.

"That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, all that portion of the Parish of Tadley known as the district of 'Heath End' (the boundaries of which portion or district are delineated on the map attached to the hereinafter mentioned Scheme and thereon verged green) may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Tadley and annexed to the Parish of Baughurst to which it is contiguous.

"We, Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester, by virtue of our Bishopric are the Patron of both the Benefices of Tadley and Baughurst the Reverend Collings Trenchard Carre being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Tadley and the Reverend William Sterndale Steggall being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Baughurst.

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Pluralities Act, We, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of us as Patron of the Benefices of Tadley and Baughurst and also the consent of the Incumbent of the Benefice of Tadley (the Incumbent of Baughurst not so consenting) to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Tadley and annex to the Parish of Baughurst all that portion of the Parish of Tadley known as the District of Heath End the boundaries of which portion or district are delineated on the map hereto annexed and thereon verged green.

"That the Incumbent of Baughurst shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within that portion or district of the Parish of Tadley so to be separated from Tadley and annexed to Baughurst.

"That the inhabitants of such portion or district shall be entitled to accommodation in

the Parish Church of Baughurst but shall cease to be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Tadley except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew in the said Parish Church of Tadley and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portion or district shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the said Parish Church of Baughurst as they might have had in the Parish Church of Tadley.

"That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion or district so to be separated from the Parish of Tadley shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish of Baughurst.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Thomas Banks, Lord Bishop of Oxford, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honour-

able and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

“ We, Thomas Banks, Lord Bishop of Oxford, in pursuance of the Act 1 & 2 Vic., Cap. 106, sec. 26, extended by 2 & 3 Vic., Cap. 49, secs. 6-8, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

“ There is in the County and Diocese of Oxford an altogether extra-parochial place known as Cutteslowe having a present population of 85 or thereabouts situate on the east side of and contiguous to the Parish of Wolvercot and on the north and west sides of and contiguous to the Parish of Kidlington both in the same County and Diocese. There is no Church within this place and no endowments or emoluments. The residents have always used Wolvercot Church for marriages and as the said place is within easy access of the City of Oxford and further houses are in course of erection therein it is important that it should have Parochial status. There is a sufficient house of residence belonging to the benefice of Wolvercot.

“ There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Wolvercot the Parish whereof contains a population of 1,831 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 300 persons. The gross annual value of the said Parish of Wolvercot is £395 or thereabouts and a house.

“ There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Kidlington the Parish whereof contains a present estimated population of 2,024 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 765 persons. The gross annual value of the said Benefice is £330 or thereabouts with a house.

“ There is also in the same County and Diocese the Perpetual Curacy or Benefice of Summertown the Parish whereof contains a present population of 4,949 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 620 persons. The gross annual value of the said Benefice is £450 or thereabouts with a house.

“ There is also in the same County and Diocese the Perpetual Curacy and Benefice of St. Margaret, Oxford the Parish whereof contains a population of 1,760 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 625 persons. The gross annual value of the said Benefice is £405 or thereabouts with a house.

“ It appears to us and we do hereby represent to Your Grace under the provisions of the said Acts as follows:—

“ 1. That the extra-parochial place of Cutteslowe (which is particularly delineated on the plan attached to the Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon edged in yellow) may with advantage be annexed as to the greater part thereof to the said Parish of Wolvercot to which it is contiguous and as to the remainder to the said Parish of Summertown to which if the Scheme attached to this Representation be certified it will be contiguous.

“ 2. That the portion of the Parish of Kidlington being a well defined district lying between the said extra-parochial place of Cutteslowe and the said Parish of Summertown and known as Water Eaton (which is particularly delineated on the aforesaid plan

and thereon edged in green) which is distant about 4 miles from the Parish Church of Kidlington and in which a considerable number of houses are in course of erection may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Kidlington and be united as to part to the adjoining Parish of Wolvercot and as to the remainder to the adjoining Parish of Summertown to which such parts may respectively be more conveniently annexed.

“ 3. That the portion of the Parish of Summertown particularly delineated in the said plan and thereon coloured pink containing a population of 460 or thereabouts may be advantageously separated therefrom and be united to the adjoining Parish of St. Margaret, Oxford to which it may be more conveniently annexed.

“ 4. The Warden and Scholars of the House or College of Scholars of Merton in the University of Oxford are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Wolvercot and the Reverend Paul Edward Rebeck is the present Incumbent thereof.

“ The President and Scholars of St. John Baptist College in the University of Oxford are the Patrons of the said Benefices of Summertown and St. Margaret, Oxford and the Reverend Evan Gabriel Burrough and the Reverend Edward Wilfred Pullan are respectively the present Incumbents thereof.

“ The Rector and Scholars of Exeter College in the University of Oxford are the Patrons of the Benefice of Kidlington and the Reverend Iorwerth Lloyd-Jones is the present Incumbent thereof.

“ Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Act 1 & 2 Vic. Cap. 106, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up the Scheme in writing attached to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the Patrons and Incumbents of the Benefices concerned to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council.”

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

“ SCHEME.

“ It is proposed

“ In regard to Cutteslowe—First—

“ 1. That the portion of the extra-parochial place known as Cutteslowe which lies to the north of the centre of the new main road shown on the said plan and to the east of and contiguous to the Parish of Wolvercot and the boundaries of which are delineated on the plan attached hereto and thereon edged in yellow shall be annexed to and form part of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Wolvercot.

“ 2. That the Incumbent of Wolvercot shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion of Cutteslowe.

“ 3. That the Inhabitants of such portion of Cutteslowe shall be entitled to accommodation

in the Parish Church of Wolvercot and the right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnised and performed therein.

" 4. That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion of Cutteslowe shall belong to the Incumbent of the benefice of Wolvercot.

" Second—

" 1. That the portion of the extra-parochial place known as Cutteslowe which lies to the south of the centre of the said new main road and to the east of and contiguous to that portion of the Parish of Kidlington which is hereinafter proposed should be annexed to the Parish of Summertown and which is edged and hatched in yellow on the said plan shall be annexed to and form part of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Summertown.

" 2. That the Incumbent of Summertown shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion of Cutteslowe.

" 3. That the Inhabitants of such portion of Cutteslowe shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Summertown and the right to have marriages churchings baptisms and burials solemnised and performed therein.

" 4. That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from such portion of Cutteslowe shall belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Summertown.

" In regard to Wolvercot and Kidlington—

" 1. That there be separated from the ecclesiastical Parish of Kidlington and annexed to the ecclesiastical Parish of Wolvercot a portion of the former Parish being that portion of the well defined district known as Water Eaton which lies to the north of the centre of the said new main road and which with the boundaries thereof is delineated on the said plan and thereon edged and hatched in green. There is no Church within this portion and no endowments.

" 2. That the Incumbent of Wolvercot shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated.

" 3. That the Inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Wolvercot but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Church of Kidlington except nevertheless any such Inhabitant or Inhabitants possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Church of Kidlington and who may not be willing to relinquish the same.

" 4. That the Inhabitants of such portion shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnised and performed in the said Parish Church of Wolvercot as but for the said separation they might have had in the Parish Church of Kidlington.

" 5. That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments received from the said portion of the said district so to be separated from the Parish of Kidlington shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish of Wolvercot.

" 6. That no alteration except as aforesaid shall be made in the emoluments or endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

" 7. That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

" In regard to Summertown and Kidlington—

" 1. That there be separated from the ecclesiastical Parish of Kidlington and annexed to the ecclesiastical Parish of Summertown a portion of the former Parish being that portion of the well defined district known as Water Eaton which lies to the south of the centre of the said new main road and which with the boundaries thereof is delineated in the plan attached hereto and thereon edged in green. There is no Church within this district and no endowments.

" 2. That the Incumbent of Summertown shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion of the said district so to be separated.

" 3. " 4. That the Inhabitants of the said portion of the said district shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnised and performed in the said Parish Church of Summertown as but for the said separation they might have had in the Parish Church of Kidlington.

" 5. That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion of the said district so to be separated from the Parish of Kidlington shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Summertown.

" 6. That no alteration except as aforesaid shall be made in the endowments or emoluments of the said Benefices or either of them.

" 7. That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

" In regard to Summertown and St. Margaret, Oxford—

" 1. That there shall be separated from the ecclesiastical Parish of Summertown and annexed to the ecclesiastical parish of St. Margaret, Oxford, that portion of the former Parish which is delineated on the plan attached hereto and thereon coloured pink. There is no Church or Chapel within this portion of the said Parish of Summertown.

" 2. That the Incumbent of St. Margaret, Oxford, shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such district so to be separated.

" 3. That the Inhabitants of such district shall be entitled to accommodation in the parish Church of St. Margaret, Oxford, but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Church of Summertown excepting nevertheless any such Inhabitant or Inhabitants possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Church of Summertown who may not be willing to relinquish the same.

" 4. That the Inhabitants of the said district shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnised and performed in the said Parish

Church of St. Margaret, Oxford, as but for the said separation they might have had in the Parish Church of Summertown.

" 5. That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said district, so to be separated from the Parish of Summertown shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of St. Margaret, Oxford.

" 6. That no alteration except as aforesaid shall be made in the endowments or emoluments of the said Benefices or either of them.

" 7. That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

" Dated this sixth day of October one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, on the 8th December, 1932, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of the College of Saint Mary Magdalen, commonly called Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, duly made under the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, at a Meeting of the Governing Body specially summoned for the purpose on the eighth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and passed at that Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

PRELIMINARY.

This Statute is supplemental to the existing Statutes of the College, that is to say the Statutes made for the College by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and approved by His Majesty the King in Council on the twenty-sixth day of July, 1926.

DEMYSHIPS, SCHOLARSHIPS, AND EXHIBITIONS.

Statute IX. 25.—This clause (IX. 25) is hereby repealed and in its stead the following is hereby enacted:

Doncaster Scholarships.

(1) There shall be maintained within the College three Doncaster Scholarships: the holder of one shall be called the George Doncaster Scholar, of one the William Doncaster Scholar, and of one the John Doncaster Scholar.

(2) The Doncaster Scholars shall be elected by the Tutorial Board, after an examination of the candidates in such subjects and conducted in such manner as the Tutorial Board shall from time to time determine: provided that in the election of any George Doncaster Scholar special regard shall be paid to excellence in speaking, reading, and writing the Italian language, in the election of any William Doncaster Scholar special regard shall be paid to excellence in speaking, reading, and writing the French language, and in the election of any John Doncaster Scholar special regard shall be paid to excellence in speaking, reading, and writing the German language.

(3) Whenever there shall be no duly qualified candidate for a vacant Doncaster Scholarship whom the electors shall judge to be of sufficient merit for election, the election shall be postponed till such time as the Tutorial Board shall fix.

(4) A Doncaster Scholar may be permitted to pursue any recognized subject of University study upon his satisfying the Tutorial Board that he is qualified to do so with profit.

(5) A Doncaster Scholar shall enjoy such privileges and precedence in the College as the President and Fellows may think fit, and shall be elected, except in so far as it is otherwise laid down in this Statute, subject to such conditions as to age, tenure, and otherwise as the Tutorial Board may determine.

(6) A Doncaster Scholar shall hold his Scholarship for two years from a day to be fixed by the Tutorial Board, and the tenure of his Scholarship shall determine at the end of such period of two years unless the Tutorial Board shall by resolution declare themselves satisfied with the industry and good conduct of the Scholar, in which case the tenure of his Scholarship shall be renewed for a third year. The Tutorial Board may extend the tenure of a Doncaster Scholarship for a fourth year if for special reasons they deem it desirable to do so.

(7) There shall be a fund called the Doncaster Scholarships Fund, formed from the sum bequeathed by the late Mrs. Price Powell, which shall be administered by and under the authority of the Tutorial Board. The payment of the emoluments of the three Doncaster Scholars, and of the expenses of the examination of candidates for the three Doncaster Scholarships shall be a charge on the Doncaster Scholarships Fund. After such emoluments and expenses have been paid, any balance of income undisposed of may be dealt with as provided in Clause 9 below.

(8) The emoluments of a Doncaster Scholar shall be such sum, not being less than £30 nor more than £100, as the Tutorial Board shall regard as appropriate in each case. The Tutorial Board shall be entitled to take into account the pecuniary needs of a Doncaster Scholar, provided that any inquiry into pecuniary needs is made after, and in no case before, his election.

(9) If after meeting all the charges referred to in Clause 7 there remain any balance not disposed of, the Tutorial Board may

(a) elect additional George, and William, and John Doncaster Scholars in all respects as if each were elected under Clause 2 above, and

(b) pay the emoluments of each such additional Doncaster Scholar, and the expenses of the examination of candidates for each such additional Doncaster Scholarship out of such balance, and

(c) make grants out of such balance to students studying or proposing to study the Italian, or the French, or the German language, and

(d) make any payment out of such balance as the Board may decide to be calculated to encourage the study of the Italian, or the French, or the German language.

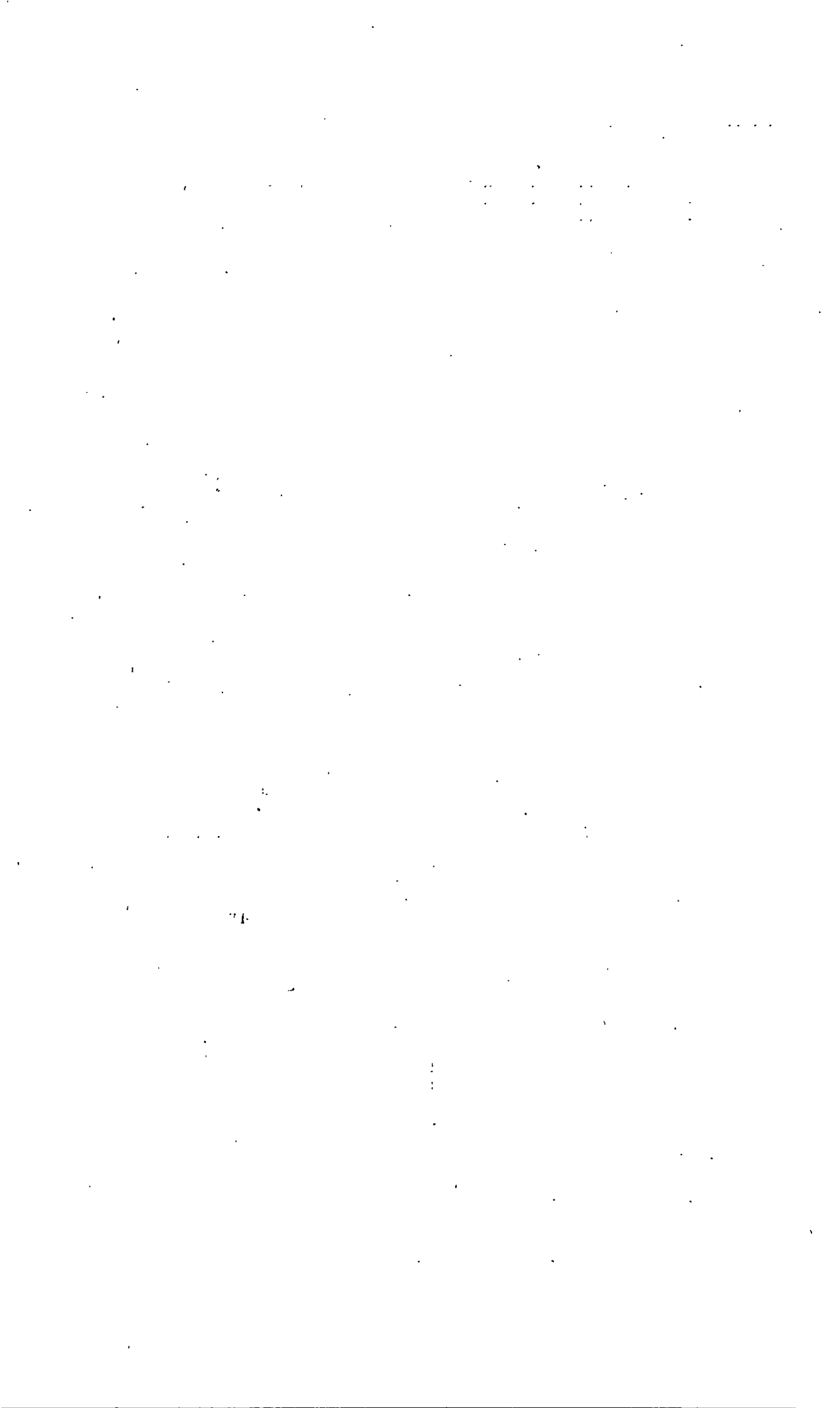
