

Parish Church of Tadley and two miles from the Parsonage House of the same Parish.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Tadley is four hundred and thirty pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Baughurst the Parish whereof contains a population of four hundred and eighty three or thereabouts (according to the Census of 1921) with accommodation in the Parish Church for two hundred and fifty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Baughurst is three hundred and eighty five pounds or thereabouts.

"That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, all that portion of the Parish of Tadley known as the district of 'Heath End' (the boundaries of which portion or district are delineated on the map attached to the hereinafter mentioned Scheme and thereon verged green) may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Tadley and annexed to the Parish of Baughurst to which it is contiguous.

"We, Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester, by virtue of our Bishopric are the Patron of both the Benefices of Tadley and Baughurst the Reverend Collings Trenchard Carre being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Tadley and the Reverend William Sterndale Steggall being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Baughurst.

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Pluralities Act, We, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of us as Patron of the Benefices of Tadley and Baughurst and also the consent of the Incumbent of the Benefice of Tadley (the Incumbent of Baughurst not so consenting) to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Tadley and annex to the Parish of Baughurst all that portion of the Parish of Tadley known as the District of Heath End the boundaries of which portion or district are delineated on the map hereto annexed and thereon verged green.

"That the Incumbent of Baughurst shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within that portion or district of the Parish of Tadley so to be separated from Tadley and annexed to Baughurst.

"That the inhabitants of such portion or district shall be entitled to accommodation in

the Parish Church of Baughurst but shall cease to be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Tadley except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew in the said Parish Church of Tadley and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portion or district shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the said Parish Church of Baughurst as they might have had in the Parish Church of Tadley.

"That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion or district so to be separated from the Parish of Tadley shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish of Baughurst.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.
