

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in packing bread and confectionery in the despatch department at the works of Thomas Scott and Sons (Bakers) Limited, 136-156, Knowsley Road, Bootle, Liverpool, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable cloakroom and mess-room accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided.

Eleven Hackney Carriages:

First Portion—Four carriages in centre of roadway, commencing at a point thirty-five feet West of the Western Refuge at the junction with Gloucester Road, and extending Westward, as far as necessary for four carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

Second Portion.—Seven carriages in centre of roadway, commencing at a point in line with the party wall of Nos. 100/102, Cromwell Road, and extending Westward, as far as necessary for seven carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.
