The Chief Inspector of Factories gives notice that in consequence of the resignation of Dr. A. C. Goodwin an appointment as Certifying Surgeon under the Factory and Workshop Acts at Newport, in the County of Isle of Wight, is vacant.

The Secretary for Mines announces that he has made an Order under Section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, amending the Explosives in Coal Mines (Electrical Shot-Firing Apparatus) Order, 1932.

The effect of the amending Order is that, in mines to which Part II of the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of 1st September, 1913, applies, shotfiring apparatus which was lawfully in use on 31st March, 1932, may continue to be used until 1st November, 1933, instead of being replaced before 1st January, 1933, by apparatus of a type approved by the Board of Trade. After 1st November, 1933, only approved types may be in use.

The amendment does not affect the requirement in the main Order that all new shotfiring apparatus introduced into such mines must be of approved type.
