The Compliments upon the approaching Marriage have been given, and received on all fides with great Expressions of Satisfaction, and it is thought that Solemnity will not be long deterred. The Count drivers, Ambassador trom France, has lavely had an Audience of the King of Sueden, in which he delivered to him a Letter from the Most Christian King; and he has snow been several times in Conference with the Ministers at this Court, upon some Proposals from that Crown. The Duke and Dutchess of Orleans are gone to their House at St. Clou, where they intend to remain part of the We have Advice from Lyons, That Sunimer. the Prince of Monaco arrived there the 21th Infrant going for Monaco, and the Duke of Sefto for Madrid; and that the next day the Prince of Vaudement came thither in his way to Milan, and was Complimented by the Magistracy: And that the Regiments of Horse of Buffi and Broglio were marched through that place for Vienne in Dauphine, where they are to remain till further Orders.
