unoccupied premises, the inspection and testing of meters, the prevention of the improper use of gas, the supply of gas fittings etc., the removal of fittings, charges for special reading of meters, the period of error in defective meters, anti-fluctuators for gas engines, the supply to persons in debt for other premises, relief from obligation to supply, and to empower the Company to provide dwelling houses for their employees, offices, show-rooms etc.

10. To provide as to the authentication and service of notices by the Company, the recovery of demands and penalties, the inclusion of several sums in one summons and that the Order shall not affect the powers of the Company under their Memorandum and Articles of Association.

11. To incorporate and apply, with or without modification, any provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Acts 1847 and 1871, the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1932 and to re-enact, repeal or amend any provisions of the Ashburton Gas Order 1899 confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Gas) Act 1899 and the Ashburton Gas (Charges) Order 1924 (S.R. & O. 1924 No. 43) and any other Act or Order affecting the undertaking.

Any local or other public authority Company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the Draft (161)

Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 3rd day of March, 1933.

Any objection must state (a) the specific grounds of objection and (b) the omissions additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection must be forwarded to the applicants for the Order addressed to the undersigned Solicitors and Parliamentary Agents at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.

A copy of the draft Order and of the Ordnance Maps showing the limits of supply and the existing works of the Council and the lands referred to in paragraph 6 hereof have been deposited for public inspection at the office of the Council at The Town Hall, Ashburton, and with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Devon at his office at The Castle, Exeter.
