The Turks at Belgrade and Temeswaer are very apprehen-five of being besieged the next Summer, and at Belgrade they are making several new Fortifications, and for the more speedy finishing of the same, have summoned all the Villages thereabouts to fend each a certain number of Men to be employed in this work.
