

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following payments from the funds of Greenwich Hospital, viz. :—

(1) A pension to Mr. W. H. Waite at the rate of Twenty four pounds eleven shillings and four pence (£24 11s. 4d.) per annum as from the 1st September, 1932, and a gratuity of One hundred and eighty three pounds, six shillings and three pence (£183 6s. 3d.).

(2) A gratuity of Two hundred pounds (£200) to Lieutenant Commander Yeo on the Retired List of Your Majesty's Fleet."

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of January, 1933 (N. 5657/32), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions,

as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the conditions prescribed by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 20th day of December, 1927, in regard to the payment of extra pay to the bakery staffs of Your Majesty's Ships fitted with bakeries, when employed in making bread for issue to other of Your Majesty's Ships not so fitted, require revision in order to provide for payment, in certain types of vessels with bakeries of small capacity, of extra pay when the quantity of bread baked for other ships equals or exceeds 60 lbs.:

"Subject nevertheless to the conditions that payment of extra pay at these rates is not to be made to more than four ratings per diem in any ship; that payment is not to be made for quantities of less than 120 lbs. of bread produced in capital ships and large aircraft carriers, or less than 60 lbs. in Cruisers and small aircraft carriers and below; and that payment at the higher rate is to be allowed to only one Chief Petty Officer Cook or Petty Officer Cook even though more than one rating of these grades is employed.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."
