The following Statute made by the University of Cambridge, on the 11th day of February, 1933, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

STATUTE TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES IN RELATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE MADE UNDER "THE UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923" (13 & 14 GEORGE V., CHAPTER 33), WHICH AMENDING STATUTE IS NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING IN COUNCIL.

We, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE D. CHAPTER XIII.

THE PROFESSORS.

By deleting in Section 1 of this Chapter the words "The Vere Harmsworth Professorship of Naval History;" and substituting

therefor the words "The Vere Harmsworth Professorship of Imperial and Naval History;" and by adding the following paragraph at the end of the Section:

"Notwithstanding the title of the Vere Harmsworth Professorship of Imperial and Naval History it shall be competent for the Electors on each occasion to elect a Professor who proposes to profess solely or chiefly the History of the British Empire, or one who proposes to profess solely or chiefly Naval History."

SCHEDULE B.

UNIVERSITY OFFICERS WHOSE OFFICES QUALIFY THEM TO HOLD PROFESSORIAL FELLOWSHIPS.

By deleting the words "The Vere Harmsworth Professor of Naval History;" in this Schedule and substituting therefor the words "The Vere Harmsworth Professor of Imperial and Naval History;".
