

Fisheries has made the following Order dated 14th February, 1933. This Order comes into operation on the 18th February, 1933.

Order No. 5090.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1933 (No. 38).

SUBJECT.

(1) Releases the Wilts Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area from restrictions.

(2) Revokes Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Orders of 1933 (Nos. 13, 14, 20, 21, 25, 28, 30, 32, 34 and 37) and declares the following to be Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925:—

1. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Berks.

The county borough of Reading.

The parishes of Earley, Woodley and Sandford, and Sonning Town.

In the county of Oxford.

The parishes of Harpsden, Shiplake, Eye and Dunsden, Kidmere End, and Mapledurham.

2. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Buckingham.

The parishes of Denham, Iver, Langley Marish and its detached part, Wexham, Fulmer, Gerrards Cross, and Stoke Poges (*except its detached part*).

In the county of Hertford.

The parish of Rickmansworth Rural (*except its detached parts*).

In the county of Middlesex.

The petty sessional division of Uxbridge (*except the parishes of Harmondsworth, and Cranford*).

3. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Buckingham.

The borough of Aylesbury.

The petty sessional divisions of Linslade, Aylesbury (*except the parishes of Aston Sandford, Ilmer, Towersey, Monks Risborough, Princes Risborough, Horsenden, and Little Missenden*), Brill (*except the parishes of Boarstall, Oakley, Worminghall, Ickford, and Shabbington*).

The parishes of Edgcott, Middle Claydon, East Claydon, Grandborough, Hoggston, Duntun, Creslow, Whitchurch, Pitchcott, Oving, North Marston, Hogshaw and its detached part, Quainton, Cholesbury and its detached part, Hawridge, Chartridge, Ashley Green, and Chesham.

In the county of Hertford.

The parishes of Tring Rural, Tring Urban, Puttenham, Aldbury, Wigginton, Northchurch (*except its detached parts*), Great Berkhamstead Urban, and Great Berkhamstead Rural and its detached part.

In the county of Bedford.

The parishes of Leighton Buzzard, and Bilington.

4. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Surrey.

The borough of Guildford.

The petty sessional division of Woking (*except the parishes of Byfleet, Pyrford, Wisley, and Ockham*).

The parishes of West Clandon, Merrow, St. Martha, Shalford, Artington, Compton, Wanborough, Puttenham, Ash and Normandy, so much of the parish of Frimley as lies to the east of the road from Farnborough via Frimley and the Jolly Farmer to Bagshot, and Chobham (*except that part of the parish of Chobham which lies to the north of the road from Ottershaw via Dolley's Farm, North Bourne, Chobham and Parkhurst to Turf Hill*).

5. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Southampton.

The city of Winchester and the borough of Basingstoke.

The petty sessional divisions of Basingstoke, Odiham (*except the borough of Aldershot and the parishes of Farnborough, Hawley, and Yateley*), Kingsclere (*except the parish of East Woodhay*), Alresford, Winchester (*except the parishes of Little Somborne, Kings Somborne, Ashley, Hursley, Compton, Otterbourne, Twyford, Owslebury, and Colden Common*), and Alton (*except the parishes of Headley, and Grayshott*).

The parishes of St. Mary Bourne, Hurstbourne Priors, Longparish, Bullington, Barton Stacey, Chilbolton, Greatham, Hawkley, Colemore and Priors Dean, Froxfield, Warnford, and so much of the parishes of West Meon and East Meon as lies to the north of the road from Warnford via West Meon and East Meon to Langrish.

In the county of Berks.

The petty sessional division of Reading (*except the parishes of Streatley, Ashampstead, Basildon, Bradfield, Pangbourne, Purley, Tilehurst, Tidmarsh, Sulham, Theale, and Englefield*).

The parishes of Sandford, Greenham, Thatcham, Brimpton, Midgham, Wasing, and Woolhampton and its detached part.
