lations the following provisions of the Will shall cease to have any operation:

(a) The obligation upon the Master of annual residence in the Mansion House;

(b) The forfeiture provisions consequent upon non-residence by the Master;

- (6) No Master of the College shall have any claim or right of indemnity against the College or against any preceding Master or his estate in respect of any act or omission authorised by the provisions of this Statute or of any Regulations made hereunder.
