TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 3rd March, 1933, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 6th March, 1933, to Saturday, the 11th March, 1933, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT HOUSEMASTERS IN BORSTAL INSTITUTIONS (MALES) UNDER THE PRISON COMMISSION.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held on occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies; the competitions are open to male candidates only.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 21 and must not normally have attained the age of 35 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. In the case, however, of candidates having exceptionally suitable qualifications consideration may be given to applications from candidates slightly over the age of 35.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

They may also, if they think fit, assist in the scrutiny of the application forms of the candidates.

6. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have such experience and education as fit them for the post. In general, candidates should be men of

sound general education, able to hold their own with all ranks and to fill a position of responsibility in which tact and judgment are required. They should have personal knowledge of the life of working-class lads. A keen interest in difficult reformatory work is essential.

7. Candidates who are proposed by the Prison Commissioners and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board consisting of representatives of the Prison Commissioners and of the Civil Service Commissioners, who will select for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, provided they find so many suitable.
