The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Balliol College, Oxford, on the 4th day of March, 1933, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Balliol College in the University of Oxford duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of Balliol College especially summoned for that purpose on the twelfth day of January One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three and passed at such meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

STATUTE for Balliol College made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

## PRELIMINARY.

This Statute is supplementary to the existing Statutes of the College that is to say the Statutes dated the 19th day of December 1925 made for the College by the University of Oxford Commissioners and the Statutes made for the College by the Master and Fellows dated respectively the 18th day of March 1928

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the 6th day of December 1928 and the 4th day of December 1929.

## XI.—SPECIAL AND TEMPORARY PROVISIONS.

Clause 2 (f) (ii) is hereby repealed and in its stead the following is hereby enacted:—

"A Fellow who upon ceasing to be a Tutorial Fellow becomes entitled to a pension in the form of an annuity under the Statutes made for the College in the year 1881, with the Schedule and the amendments above mentioned, may, upon ceasing to be a Tutorial Fellow apply to the Master and Fellows for the grant to him of a single sum of money in commutation of such annuity; and a Fellow who if he had ceased on the date of such application to be a Tutorial Fellow would have been entitled to a pension in the form of an annuity under the Statutes Schedule and amendments aforesaid may at any time before ceasing to be a Tutorial Fellow apply to the Master and Fellows for the commutation of such annuity by a Deed of Covenant under the corporate seal of the College to pay to him his executors or administrators on his ceasing to be a Tutorial Fellow (whether by death or otherwise) a single sum of money; and the Master and Fellows, with the consent of the Visitor, may in either case grant the application and as the case may be pay or covenant to pay to him his executors or administrators on his ceasing to be a Tutorial Fellow such a sum from the capital or income of the

Pension Fund, if they are satisfied that the actual or prospective interests of none of the other Fellows of the College will thereby be injuriously affected, and that the capital or income of the Pension Fund will be sufficient for the purpose without necessitating any call upon the corporate revenues of the College which would not otherwise have been made; any sum so covenanted to be paid shall be paid accordingly on his ceasing to be a Tutorial Fellow; but the sum so paid or covenanted to be paid shall not be larger than would have been, in the opinion of the professional auditors of the annual Accounts of the College, the sum in return for which a Life Assurance Company of good standing would have undertaken at the date of the application to pay to the said Fellow for his life from that date an annuity equal to the pension to which he was then entitled or would then have been entitled if he had ceased to be a Tutorial Fellow on that date; Provided always that if the application is made within three months after the earliest date on which such Fellow would have become entitled to a pension as aforesaid or within three months after the date of the coming into operation of this sub-paragraph (whichever is the later) it may if the Master and Fellows agree be deemed to have been made on the earliest date on which such Fellow would have become entitled to a pension as aforesaid."
