of West Derby, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north west and upon the remaining part of the south west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of West Derby from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, at a point in the middle of Prescot Road opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Honey's Green Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Prescot Road for a distance of 141 chains or thereabouts to its junction with East Prescot Road and Pilch Lane, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Pilch Lane for a distance of 59 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the place where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, from the said New Parish of Roby, reaches the southern side of Pilch Lane. and extending thence south westward in a straight line for a distance of 6 yards or thereabouts to the last-mentioned boundary.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of West Derby which is bounded upon the east by the said New Parish of Roby, upon the south and upon the south west by the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north west and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, from the said Parish of West Derby, at a point in the middle of Honey's Green Lane opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Prescot Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Honey's Green Lane for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Yewtree Lane, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Yewtree Lane for a distance of 46 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Finch Lane, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Finch Lane for a distance of 39 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading past the southern side of the house and property known as Fincham into Lordens Lane, and extending thence south eastward to and along the middle of such foot-path for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of West Derby from the said New Parish of Roby."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 16th day of February, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Barnabas, Peterborough, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, Peterborough, in the County of Northampton and in the Diocese of Peterborough:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Peterborough, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Paul, Peterborough, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Peterborough, and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Peterborough, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Barnabas, Peterborough, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, as well of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Peterborough, as of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Peterborough, and
