

hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Michael, Tokyngton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Michael, Tokyngton'.

"And with the like consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Michael, Tokyngton, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being; provided always that, so long as the Reverend John William Potts Silvester, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church of Saint Michael, Tokyngton, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said John William Potts Silvester.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Michael, Tokyngton, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the south west by the New Parish of Saint James, Alperton, upon the east partly by the Parish of West Twyford, partly by the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Stonebridge, and partly by the Parish of Willesden, upon the north partly by the District of Saint Andrew, Kingsbury, and partly by the District Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the west partly by the last named District Chapelry, and partly by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides such District Chapelry from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, at the centre of the bridge which carries Wembley Hill Road across the Harrow Line of the London and North Eastern Railway, and extending thence first southward and then south westward along the middle of Wembley Hill Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its western junction with Harrow Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Harrow Road for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading past the western side of the London Midland and Scottish Railway Company's Athletic Ground to Alperton, and extending thence southward to and along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the footbridge which carries it across the Main Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway

upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Wembley, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Alperton."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.
