RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 10 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act, to make Regulations in regard to "roundabout" traffic working at the junction of North Circular Road with Colney Hatch Lane, Friern Barnet, Middlesex.

And notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the Minister of Transport has, under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (No. 4) Provisional Regulations, 1933, to bring into force the above-mentioned scheme on the third day of April, 1933, as Provisional Regulations to continue in force until Regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.

ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS, 1882 TO 1928.

LONDON AND HOME COUNTIES ELECTRICITY DISTRICT.

Whereas the Electricity Commissioners commenced a Local Inquiry at the Institution of Electrical Engineers, Savoy Place, Victoria Embankment, W.C.2, on Wednesday, 8th February, 1933, with reference (a) to a draft Order entitled the London and Home Counties Electricity District (Amendment) (No. 1) Order, 1933; (b) to a Scheme submitted by the County of London Electric Supply Company Limited, for the co-ordination of transmission and distribution of electricity in certain parts of the County of Surrey; and (c) to an application by the London and Home Counties Joint Electricity Authority for the consent of the Electricity Commissioners under Section 13 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1919, to the acquisition by the Joint Authority, by agreement, of the undertakings of the Urban Electric Supply Company Limited, authorised by the Caterham Electric Lighting Order, 1900, and the Woldingham and District Electricity Special Order, 1924:
