#### LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

#### RIVER DOUGLAS CATCHMENT BOARD.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming the River Douglas Catchment Board (transfer of powers in relation to the Croston Internal Drainage District) Order, 1933, made under Section 11 of the Act, which Order has now come into force.

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the said Act, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this notice make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the Court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements
