A PROCLAMATION

PROHIBITING, UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE RUSSIAN GOODS (IMPORT PROHIBITION) ACT, 1933, THE IMPORTATION INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM OF CERTAIN ARTICLES.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Russian Goods (Import Prohibition) Act, 1933, it is enacted that We may by Proclamation prohibit the importation into the United Kingdom of all goods whatsoever grown produced or manufactured in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics or of any class or description of such goods specified in the Proclamation:

And whereas We have deemed it expedient to prohibit the importation into the United Kingdom of goods so grown produced or manufactured of the classes or descriptions hereinafter specified:

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in virtue and exercise of the powers aforesaid, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation declaring and it is hereby declared that on and after the 26th day of April, 1933, the importation into the United Kingdom of goods of the classes or descriptions specified in the Schedule hereto grown produced or manufactured in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, is prohibited.

WHEAT ACT, 1932.

In accordance with the provisions of Sub-section (5), Section 5, of the Wheat Act, 1932, the Wheat Commission publish below The Wheat Byelaws, 1932, made by the Commission, in exercise of their powers under the said Act.

These Byelaws supersede the Wheat (Quota Payments and Registration) Byelaws made by the Commission on the 15th June, 1932, and published in the London Gazette on the 21st June, 1932.

PART I.

The provisions of Part I of the Wheat Byelaws, 1932, are as shown in Part I of the Wheat (Quota Payments and Registration) Byelaws, 1932, except for the following amendments:—

Byelaw 3. For "Every return made . . . one of the partners"; read

Every return delivered by a miller under the foregoing provisions of these Byelaws shall contain a certificate vouching for the accuracy of the return.

Every such certificate shall, where the miller is a company, be signed by a director or, (if the company is being wound up), by the liquidator, or where the miller is a partnership, be signed in his own name by one of the partners, or in any other case be signed by the miller.

(C) For "Making and allowance of payments . . ." read "Making and allowance of repayments . . ."

Byelaw 20. For "Any dispute arising . . . applies for it" read

Any dispute arising between the Wheat Commission and any other person as to whether any substance is flour, or as to whether any substance is bread, shall be referred to the arbitration of such member of the panel of referees appointed for the purpose by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries as may be agreed upon by the parties to the dispute or, in default of agreement, nominated by that Minister, and the decision of the referee as to the matter in dispute shall be final and conclusive.

The following provisions shall have effect in relation to any reference under this Byelaw—

(a) The Arbitration Act, 1889, shall not apply;

(b) the referee shall, as soon as practicable after entering on the reference, give his decision thereon in the form of a written award signed by him;

(c) for the purpose of enabling him to give his decision the referee may require such evidence (including statutory declarations) as he considers relevant;

(d) the costs of the reference and of the award shall be in the discretion of the referee, who may direct in his award that such sum as he thinks fit in respect of those costs be paid by or to any party to the dispute, and any sum payable under such a direction may be recovered as a debt.

B.—Claims for, and making of, deficiency payments and payments in advance on account of deficiency payments.

27. Deficiency payments due in respect of any cereal year shall be payable as from the date of the coming into force of the order made by the Minister under section two of the Act, prescribing the ascertained average price of home-grown millable wheat for that year.

28. A claim for deficiency payments in respect of any wheat, shall not be entertained unless the claim is vouched for by a wheat certificate, duly issued in the Form No. 12, 12A or 12B, set out in the Second Schedule to these Byelaws, and certifying, as respects each hundredweight of that wheat, all the facts required to be certified by a certificate so issued.

29. Every claim for deficiency payments shall be made by the claimant completing the form endorsed on the back of the wheat certificate by which the claim is required to be vouched for, and delivering the certificate to the Wheat Commission.

30. A claim for deficiency payments in respect of any wheat which has been, or is to be deemed under the Act to have been, sold in any cereal year shall not be entertained unless it is made before the expiration of one month from the date on which deficiency payments became payable in respect of that year, or the expiration of one week from the date on which the wheat certificate by which the claim is required to be vouched for was issued, whichever occurs the later:

Provided that the Wheat Commission may, in any special case, extend the time limited by the foregoing provisions of this Byelaw.

31. If, during the course of any cereal year, the Wheat Commission resolve that it is expedient that payments in advance should be made on account of deficiency payments which will become due in respect of that year, the Commission shall cause to be published, in such manner as they think best for informing persons concerned, a notice stating that they are prepared in proper cases to make such payments in advance, upon application made to them not later than such date as may be specified in the notice; and where, upon application duly made to them not later than that date by the person entitled to claim deficiency payments in respect of any wheat, the Commission are satisfied that a wheat certificate has been duly issued in respect of that wheat, and that the wheat was sold in that year otherwise than in pursuance of an order made by the Minister under sub-section (3) of section one of the Act, they may, if they think fit, make to the applicant a payment of such amount as they think proper on account of the deficiency payments which will become payable in respect of the wheat.

If it is found that, in respect of any wheat, there has been paid to any person under this Byelaw an amount in excess of the amount of the deficiency payments payable in respect of that wheat the amount of the excess shall be a debt due to the Wheat Commission.

32. Every application for such a payment in advance as aforesaid in respect of any wheat shall be made by delivering to the Wheat Commission a wheat certificate issued in respect of that wheat in the Form No. 12 or 12A, with the form endorsed on the back of the certificate duly completed by the applicant.

C.—Issue of wheat certificates.

33. Subject to the provisions of these Byelaws, wheat certificates may be issued by any dealer in wheat or miller authorised in that behalf by the Wheat Commission (hereinafter referred to as "an authorised merchant").

34. The names and addresses of all authorised merchants shall be published from time to time

in such manner as the Wheat Commission think best for informing persons concerned.

35. Every application for the issue of a wheat certificate shall be made by submitting to an authorised merchant a form of wheat certificate duly completed by the applicant, together with a request that the certificate be issued to him; and if, upon application so made, the authorised merchant decides that he can properly do so under these Byelaws, it shall be his duty to issue the certificate.

36. The issue of a wheat certificate shall be effected by the delivery to the applicant of the certificate, signed by or on behalf of the authorised merchant to whom the application for the issue thereof was made.

37. An application for the issue of a wheat certificate in respect of any wheat shall not be entertained unless it is made within eight days after the date on which the wheat was despatched on delivery to or to the order of the person named in the certificate:

Provided that the Wheat Commission may, in any special case, extend the time limited by the foregoing provisions of this Byelaw.

†38. An authorised merchant shall issue a wheat certificate only upon proof to his satisfaction that the statements of fact contained in the certificate are true and that the wheat to which the certificate relates is millable wheat which was not harvested before the year nineteen hundred and thirty-two.

39. For the purposes of the Act and of these Byelaws—

(a) where any wheat sown on land in the occupation of a registered grower becomes, before the sale of the wheat, vested in, or under the control of, any personal representative, committee, trustee or other person by reason of the registered grower having died or become subject to any legal disability or having entered into a composition or scheme of arrangement with his creditors, the personal representative, committee, trustee or other person shall be treated as a registered grower in respect of that wheat, notwithstanding that he is not registered in accordance with these Byelaws; and

(b) all wheat which has been bought by the Flour Millers' Corporation in pursuance of an order made by the Minister under sub-section (3) of section one of the Act, or which has been forfeited to the Wheat Commission by virtue of sub-section (6) of that section, shall be deemed to be home-grown millable wheat.

40. Subject to the provisions of this Part of these Byelaws relating to appeals, the decision of an authorised merchant upon any application made to him for the issue of a wheat certificate shall be final and conclusive, and, subject as aforesaid, if an authorised merchant refuses to grant such an application in respect of any wheat, no wheat certificate subsequently issued in respect of that wheat shall be of any effect.

D.—Conditions on which wheat may be removed from farm before sale.

41. Any wheat may, without ceasing to be regarded as wheat of a person's own growing,

be removed from the farm comprising the land on which it was grown, before being despatched on delivery after the sale of the wheat or after the forfeiture thereof to the Wheat Commission, as the case may be, if, and only if, the wheat is so removed in accordance with a valid permit issued by the Commission:

Provided that no such permit shall be necessary in relation to the removal of any wheat from one farm to another, if both farms are under the management of the same person, or in relation to the removal of any wheat for the purpose only of using it as a sample.

42. Every application for such a permit as aforesaid in respect of any wheat shall be made to the Wheat Commission in the Form No. 13 set out in the Second Schedule to these Byelaws, and shall specify—

(a) the farm from which the wheat is to be removed, and the occupier of that farm;

(b) the date on which, and the purposes for which, the wheat is to be removed, and the quantity of the wheat;

(c) the premises to which the wheat is to be removed, and the occupier of those premises.

43. The Wheat Commission, if they think fit, may, upon application duly made to them, issue to the occupier of any farm a permit in the Form No. 14 set out in the Second Schedule to these Byelaws, authorising the removal from the farm of such quantity of wheat as may be specified in the permit.

Every such permit shall be valid until such date only as may be specified therein.

44. On making application to an authorised merchant for the issue of a wheat certificate in respect of any wheat which has been removed under a permit issued under the last preceding Byelaw, the applicant shall produce the permit to the authorised merchant.

E.—Appeals from authorised merchants.

45. For the purpose of hearing appeals against refusals on the part of authorised merchants to issue wheat certificates, there shall be a committee (hereinafter referred to as "a local wheat committee") for each of the areas specified in the Third Schedule to these Byelaws.

46. Every local wheat committee shall (according as the Wheat Commission may determine, having regard to the needs of the area) consist of nine, twelve or fifteen persons appointed by the Commission; and of the members of every such committee, two-thirds shall be appointed as representing the interests of dealers in home-grown wheat and of millers, and one-third shall be appointed as representing the interests of registered growers.

47. The quorum of a local wheat committee shall—

(a) in the case of a committee consisting of fifteen members, be seven; and

(b) in the case of a committee consisting of twelve or nine members, be five;

and any such committee may act notwithstanding any vacancy among the members thereof, and in the event of such a committee being equally divided on any question, the chairman thereof for the time being shall have a second or casting vote.

48. Any person who is aggrieved by the refusal of an authorised merchant to grant an application for the issue of a wheat certificate

may, within seven days from the date of the refusal or within such further time as the Wheat Commission may in any special case allow, appeal against the refusal to the local wheat committee for the area in which the application for the issue of the certificate was determined or in which the wheat in respect of which the application was made is situated, or was grown, according as he may elect.

49. Every such appeal shall be commenced by a written application to the local wheat committee, having jurisdiction in the matter under the last foregoing Byelaw, for the issue of the wheat certificate in question, and the application shall specify the name and address of the authorised merchant whose refusal is appealed against.

50. If, after hearing an appeal from an authorised merchant, a local wheat committee decide that the wheat certificate required by the appellant ought to have been issued, the chairman for the time being of the committee shall issue the certificate.

Where the chairman of a local wheat committee issues a wheat certificate under this Byelaw, the provisions of Byelaw 36 of these Byelaws (which relates to the manner of issuing wheat certificates) shall apply as if the chairman were the authorised merchant referred to in the said Byelaw 36.

51. The decision of a local wheat committee upon any such appeal as aforesaid shall be final and conclusive, and for the purpose of enabling them to arrive at their decision, they may require such evidence (including statutory declarations) as they consider relevant.

F.—*Records to be kept, and returns to be furnished, by registered growers.*

52. Every registered grower shall keep a record showing, in respect of each month, the quantity of wheat bought, and the quantity of wheat sold, by him in that month, and the prices at which it was bought and sold, and shall, whenever required by the Wheat Commission so to do, furnish the Commission with a copy of the record, certified by him, relating to such period as may be specified by the Commission.

53. Every registered grower shall, if required by the Wheat Commission so to do, furnish the Commission with a return, showing the quantity of his stocks of home-grown wheat remaining unsold by him at the date of the return.

PART III.

PROVISIONS APPLICABLE WHEN FLOUR MILLERS' CORPORATION ORDERED BY MINISTER TO BUY UNSOLD STOCKS OF WHEAT.

54. Whenever an order is made by the Minister under the Act, requiring the Flour Millers' Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "the corporation") to buy unsold stocks of home-grown millable wheat, the provisions of this Part of these Byelaws shall apply.

55. The price to be paid by the corporation for any wheat tendered to them for the purposes of such an order as aforesaid by any person (hereinafter referred to as "the grower") shall be determined by agreement or, in default of agreement, by the arbitration of the appropriate local wheat committee, in

accordance with the following provisions, that is to say:—

(1) The grower may, within the period specified in the order, apply to the appropriate local wheat committee for a determination of the price of the wheat in question;

(2) upon making the application, the grower shall specify to the committee the place where the wheat in question is situated and shall submit for inspection by the committee a sample of that wheat consisting of such quantity as they may require;

(3) subject to the provisions of the next following paragraph, the committee, after inspecting the sample, shall, by reference to the price specified in the Minister's order as the proper price to be paid for home-grown millable wheat of fair average quality in the area comprising the place at which the wheat in question is situated, determine the price per hundredweight of that wheat, assuming that it corresponds in quality to the sample, and having regard both to the quality of the sample and to any fluctuations in the market prices of wheat which have, since the date of the order, occurred in the area aforesaid;

(4) the committee shall not make any determination of price unless they are satisfied, upon an inspection of the sample, that the wheat constituting the sample is home-grown millable wheat;

(5) after dealing with the application, the committee shall cause the sample to be divided into two equal parts, and shall cause one part to be delivered to the corporation or their representative, and the other part to be sealed and identified in the manner required by the Wheat Commission and to be delivered to the Commission.

56.—(1) Any objection on the part of the corporation that any wheat which a grower has tendered to them for the purposes of any such order—

(a) is not home-grown; or
(b) is not millable wheat; or
(c) is not of the quality according to which the price of the wheat was determined in accordance with the last foregoing Byelaw;

shall be made by written application to the appropriate local wheat committee within the period specified in the order or within such further time as the Wheat Commission may have allowed under subsection (5) of section one of the Act, and the application shall specify—

(i) the facts alleged as the grounds of the objection;
(ii) the name and address of the grower;
(iii) the quantity of the wheat objected to;
(iv) the place where that wheat is situated and the place at which it was tendered;

and upon application so made, the local wheat committee, acting as arbitrators, shall decide the matters in issue thereon.

(2) If the committee decide that the wheat objected to, though home-grown millable wheat, is of lower quality than that according to which the price thereof was determined in accordance with the last foregoing Byelaw, they shall, as part of their decision, determine the price which they allow as being payable for the wheat.

57. The following provisions shall have effect in relation to every application to a local wheat committee under this Part of these Byelaws:—

(a) the Arbitration Act, 1889, shall not apply;

(b) the decision of the committee shall be final and conclusive;

(c) the chairman for the time being of the committee shall, as soon as practicable, give the decision of the committee in the form of a written award signed by him, and shall deliver the award to the grower concerned and a copy thereof, certified by him, to the corporation or their representative, and shall cause the decision to be notified to the Wheat Commission;

(d) for the purpose of arriving at their decision the committee may require such evidence (including statutory declarations) as they consider relevant;

(e) the corporation and the grower concerned shall be entitled to appear and be heard on the application, either in person or by counsel, Solicitor or agent;

(f) the committee may, as part of their decision, direct that such sum as they think fit in respect of the costs of the application be paid by the corporation to the grower or by the grower to the corporation, and any sum payable under such a direction may be recovered as a debt.

58. In this Part of these Byelaws the expression "the appropriate local wheat committee" means, in relation to any wheat, the local wheat committee for the area in which that wheat is situated.

PART IV.

SUPPLEMENTARY.

A.—Provisions as to authorised merchants.

59. The authority to issue wheat certificates conferred by these Byelaws on any authorised merchant shall be subject to such conditions, not being inconsistent with these Byelaws, as the Wheat Commission may at any time impose, and may be revoked at any time by written notice served on him by the Commission.

60. No authorised merchant shall issue a wheat certificate in respect of any wheat of his own growing.

61. An authorised merchant shall, immediately after issuing any wheat certificate, send a copy thereof, duly completed, to the Wheat Commission, and shall, if he refuses to grant an application for the issue of such a certificate, forthwith send to the Commission a written notification of the fact, specifying the grounds on which the application was refused, and the name and address of the applicant, and identifying, as far as practicable, the wheat which was the subject of the application.

62. The Wheat Commission may pay to any authorised merchant such sums as they think proper in respect of expenses incurred by him for the purposes of these Byelaws in connection with any application for the issue of a wheat certificate.

B.—Provisions as to local wheat committees.

63. Every member of a local wheat committee shall hold office on such conditions, not being

inconsistent with these Byelaws, as the Wheat Commission may at any time impose.

64. No member of a local wheat committee shall hear or adjudicate upon any application relating to wheat in which he is financially interested.

65. The Wheat Commission may pay such sums as they think proper in respect of expenses incurred for the purposes of these Byelaws by any local wheat committee or by any member of such a committee.

66. A local wheat committee shall cause the Wheat Commission to be notified of every decision of the committee given on an appeal to the committee from an authorised merchant or under Part III of these Byelaws, and shall cause to be sent to the Commission a copy, duly completed, of every wheat certificate issued on such an appeal to the committee.

C.—Miscellaneous provisions.

67. If, upon application made to them in writing, the Wheat Commission are satisfied that any wheat certificate or any document issued by them for the purposes of the Act or of these Byelaws has been lost or destroyed, the Commission may cause to be issued to the applicant a copy, which shall, subject to such conditions as the Commission may impose, have effect as the original document.

68. In these Byelaws the expression "the Act" means the Wheat Act, 1932, and the expressions "miller" and "importer" mean respectively a miller of flour and an importer of flour.

The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the interpretation of these Byelaws as it applies for the interpretation of an Act.

69. The Wheat (Quota Payments and Registration) Byelaws, 1932, are hereby revoked.

Subsection (2) of section thirty-eight of the Interpretation Act, 1889 (which relates to the effect of repeals), shall apply as if the revocation aforesaid were the repeal of an enactment by another Act, and any document issued, or condition imposed, under any provision of the Wheat (Quota Payments and Registration) Byelaws, 1932, shall have effect as if it had been issued or imposed under the corresponding provision of these Byelaws:

70. These Byelaws may be cited as the Wheat Byelaws, 1932.
