

£2 10s. PER CENT. CONVERSION LOAN,
1944-1949.

6. Particulars of the Loan are given in the Notice dated 17th March, 1933, and published in the London Gazette of that date.

Copies of the Notice may be obtained at the Bank of England.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £10,000 and must specify the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of sixpence) which will be given for the amount applied for.

8. Scrip Certificates with Coupon attached for the half-year's interest due on the 1st October, 1933, will be issued in respect of accepted tenders. These Scrip Certificates may be inscribed or registered forthwith, or they may be exchanged in due course for Bonds to Bearer.

9. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

10. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock)
