

## RURAL DISTRICT OF PONTEFRACT.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BY an Order dated the eleventh day of May, 1933, the Minister of Health has Declared that, on and after the twenty-sixth day of June, 1933, the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the several contributory places within the rural district of Pontefract, namely:—

Part V (which relates to Common Lodging-houses).

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards Section 75, to the conditions specified in the Order.

A copy of the Order may be inspected at Tanshelf House, Pontefract, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

## COUNTY BOROUGH OF WIGAN.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930. PART V. SECTIONS  
101 AND 102.

NORTH WESTERN TRAFFIC AREA. PUBLIC SERVICE  
VEHICLES.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the County Borough of Wigan have made an application, under Section 101 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, to the Traffic Com-

missioners for the North Western Traffic Area, for consent to the running by the said Council of Public Service Vehicles, namely, motor omnibuses on a certain road in that area.

The description of the road to which the application refers is as follows:—

“Landgate Lane, Ashton-in-Makerfield, in the County of Lancaster, for a distance of 1 mile 140 yards, namely, from the junction of Landgate Lane aforesaid with Park Lane, Ashton-in-Makerfield aforesaid, to Bryn Hall Collieries, Ashton-in-Makerfield aforesaid.”

And notice is hereby further given that objection may be made to the Traffic Commissioners by any other Local Authority, by the Council of any County, or by any persons who are already providing transport facilities on, or in the neighbourhood of any part of the road to which the application relates not later than Monday, the 19th day of June, 1933, by sending in triplicate the objection in writing to the Traffic Commissioners for the North Western Area, 9, Gore Street, Piccadilly, Manchester. Every objection must state the grounds on which it is based.

A copy of every such objection must be sent to the Town Clerk, Municipal Buildings, Library Street, Wigan, at the same time as it is sent to the Commissioners.
