WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 18th day of May, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presenta-

tion to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Hall Green in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Birmingham :

“ Whereas by virtue of an Order of the Board of the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales made on the 31st day of July, 1931, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hall Green is vested in the Trustees of the Marston's Chapel Advowson Charity (hereinafter called ‘ the said Advowson Trustees ’):

“ And whereas the said Advowson Trustees are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hall Green now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Birmingham for the time being; to the intent that from time to time when and so often as the said Benefice shall become vacant he the Bishop of Birmingham for the time being shall duly admit institute collate or licence thereto such duly qualified person as shall be nominated or chosen by the persons being at the time of the said vacancy of the said Benefice the Bishop of Birmingham, the Vicar or Incumbent of the Benefice of Yardley, in the said County of Warwick and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, and the vice-Chairman of the Parochial Church Council of the said Parish of Hall Green :

"And whereas the Right Reverend Ernest William, now Bishop of Birmingham, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Hall Green which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Hall Green:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Advowson Trustees (in testimony whereof this Scheme has been signed and sealed by four of the said Advowson Trustees under the authority conferred upon them by a resolution passed at a meeting of the said Advowson Trustees duly convened for that purpose and held on the 11th day of April, 1933), and with the consent of the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hall Green, shall be transferred to the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever upon the nomination of the three persons hereinbefore described.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Birmingham.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mary, South Elmsall, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 23rd day of January, 1911, and published in the London Gazette on the following day a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Mary situate at South Elmsall, in the Parish of South Kirkby, in the said County of York and at that time in the Diocese of York, but now in the said Diocese of Wakefield, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mary, South Elmsall':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint Mary, South Elmsall, has, under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, South Elmsall, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Buchanan, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, South Elmsall, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of South Kirkby, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered

from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, South Elmsall.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Mary, South Elmsall, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, being:—

"All that portion of the Parish of South Kirkby, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south east by the said New Parish of Saint Mary, South Elmsall, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the north west, and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary, South Elmsall, from the said Parish of South Kirkby crosses the middle of the Swinton and Knottingly Joint Line of the London, Midland and Scottish and London and North Eastern Railways, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 46 chains or thereabouts to a point distant 50 yards from the south side of the bridge which carries Kirkby Bridge Field Lane across such line of railway, and extending thence north eastward in a line parallel to and at a distance of 50 yards from the southern side of Kirkby Bridge Field Lane for a distance of 25½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the West Riding and Grimsby Line of the London and North Eastern Railway and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway for a distance of 25½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of South Kirkby from the said New Parish of Saint Mary, South Elmsall."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.
