A STATUTE to amend Statute IV made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5, ch. 33), for the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College in the University of Oxford, duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting specially summoned for this purpose and holden on Friday, May 26th, 1933, and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and ordered for sealing after the consent of the University had been given on the fifth day of June, 1933 (Oxford University Gazette, LXIII, No. 2037, page 571), and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend Statute IV of the College Statutes in order to secure 65-33952

the residence in the College of such number of Official Fellows as may be sufficient for purposes of discipline:

Now, therefore, WE, the Master and Fellows of the said College, in virtue of all and every the powers enabling us contained in Statute XIII. 1 of our Statutes and Section 7 (2) of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5, ch. 33), do alter and amend the Statutes of the College in so far as they relate to the residence of Officers

by the following omissions and alterations: In Statute IV, clause 2, paragraph 1, we strike out the last five lines of the paragraph and we substitute the words: "Such consent shall not be given unless there shall be at the time at least three Official Fellows resident in the College."
