

junction with Quinton Lane and extending thence first eastward and then south eastward along the middle of the new course of Quinton Lane for a distance of 21½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Hagley Road West, and extending thence northward to and along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Hagley Road West, and extending thence first northward to and then eastward along the middle of Hagley Road West for a distance of 18½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Balden Road where the boundaries of the said Parish of Christ Church at the Quinton, of the said Parish of Harborne, and of the said District of Saint Hilda, Warley Woods, all meet.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been

transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Birmingham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of July, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the County of Gloucester now vested in us:

“Whereas the property particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.
