COLONIAL STOCK ACT 1900 (63 AND 64 VICT. C. 62).
ADDITION TO LIST OF STOCKS UNDER SECTION 2.

Pursuant to Section 2 of the Colonial Stock Act 1900 the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that the provisions of the Act have been complied with in respect of the undermentioned Stock inscribed in the United Kingdom:—

Kenya Government 3½ per cent. Inscribed Stock 1957-1967.

The restrictions mentioned in Section 2 Sub-section (1) of the Trustee Act 1925 apply to the above Stock (see Colonial Stock Act 1900, Section 2).

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in pressing and drilling wireless set parts

at the Lissenium Works of Lissen Limited, Worples Road, Isleworth, Middlesex, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable cloakroom and mess-room accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 years of age and over in attending a Mann's Quad Crown Offset Rotary Lithographic Machine at the works of Messrs. Hudson and Son, 155-171, Edmund Street, Birmingham, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, adequate arrangements for preparing and taking meals and washing facilities shall be provided.
