DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1932.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY.

Whereas Gerald Douglas Newton, L.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., formerly of 2, Walker Terrace, Gateshead, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said Gerald Douglas Newton cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said Gerald Douglas Newton, the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves, Indian Hemp and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Gerald Douglas Newton to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.
