MERCHANDISE MARKS.

DECLARATION, DATED OCTOBER 20, 1933, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE, WITH THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, UNDER SECTION 10 (1) OF THE MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 GEO. 5. c. 53).

Whereas by subsection (1) of Section 10 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 53) it is provided, that for the purposes of the said Act, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression "agricultural and horticultural produce and the produce of any fishing industry" includes all foodstuffs other than such foodstuffs as the Board of Trade (hereinafter called "the Board") with the concurrence of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries may declare not to be foodstuffs for the purposes of that definition:

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has concurred in a proposal of the Board to declare edible rice starch (including rice starch cornflour) and edible maize starch cornflour not to be foodstuffs for the purposes of the said definition:

Now, therefore, the Board, with the concurrence of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, hereby declare edible rice starch (including rice starch courflour) and edible maize starch cornflour not to be foodstuffs for the purposes of the aforesaid definition.

THE DURHAM DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.
