ea his Presentions upon Spain for the space of one whole year's but to the end he may by his own example invite other Christian Porentates to the same good work, he is resolved to send a possiderable part of his forces to the relief of Candia a under the Command of the Duke de Navailles, viz. 5000 Foot and 300 Horse, and particularly the Regiments which were ordered to march for Ronfeillon, and thole now in Dauphine; belides 420 men drawn out of the Regiment of Guards, and 200 of His Majesties Musketeers 200 Reformed Officers are also made choice of, and ordered to repair with all possible speed to Thoulon; where they are to embark with the rest for the same service; for which are firring up all the Gallies, and 24 of his Majesties Men of War, which are to be commanded by the Duke de Bruffers; who'e Equipage is already fent away for Thoulan and himself preparing suddenly to follow. The Marchal de Bellefonds is also leavying his acoo Foot, and 'tis said is to command the forces deligned by the Pope for the affile. ance of the Venerians. All these succors are ordered to be fent with as much speed as is possible, since the condition of Candia requires it ; the Brench Sucrors under the Duke de Raumer having quitted the place about the beginning of the last Moneth, and are returning homewards; which tis feared may as much have dishearened the belieged, as it has given fresh boldness to the Turks.

From Nancy we are informed, that the Marefial de Grequy left the Gountrey about Pens a Moussian the 7th instant, and ordered the forces which he left there to quit the Town, the 10th upon Orders sent to him from His Most Christian Majetty to give it up again into the hands of the Duke of

Lorrain.

Cardinal Francisco Barberin, Protector of the Religion of St. Francis, having written to the Superiors of the Cordilers, giving liberty to such of the Order as pleased to take Armes for the assistance of Candis, Several of them are already quitting their Frock, and taking up the sword for that service.

From Barcellona we are told, That Don Juan has quitted the Frontiers, and is gone to some place about to Leagues from Madrid 5 from whence he has witten submissified Laurens to the Queen Regent, but still insisting upon the randomized Father Nithard from publick Employments.

The King baving refoly'd to reform such of the Companies of his Foushold as were of the Reformed Religion, they have been perswaded to prevent Cashiering, to desire a fair dismission, and have accordingly given up their Coats, and quirted the service.
