Whereas parts of certain superintendent registrars' districts and of certain sub-districts which are situate partly within and partly outside the Counties of the Parts of Kesteven (Lincolnshire), Rutland and the Soke of Peterborough or one of them will on the 1st day of January, 1934, in consequence of and by virtue of the Parts of Kesteven Registration Scheme, 1933, the Rutland Registration Scheme, 1933, and the Soke of Peterborough Registration Scheme, 1933, made by the Councils of the Counties of the Parts of Kesteven (Lincolnshire), Rutland and the Soke of Peterborough respectively and approved by the Minister of Health under Section 24 of the Local Government Act, 1929, become separate superintendent registrars' districts and subdistricts respectively situate wholly outside the said Counties;
