

and by the creation and issue of debenture stock or by either of such means and to make provisions as to the rights privileges and liabilities of the holders of mortgages and debenture stock of the Company.

To repeal all or any of the provisions of the Weston-super-Mare Gas Acts and Orders 1855 to 1928 prescribing a maximum price or prices for gas supplied by the Company and a maximum rate of dividend on the ordinary stock of the Company.

To prescribe or fix a basic price or basic prices for the gas to be supplied by the Company and to make provision as to the revision of such basic price or basic prices.

To authorise the Company to charge different prices within different parts of their limits of supply, to re-define, modify or alter the existing powers of the Company of charging differential prices and the areas within which the same may be charged and to confer upon the Company new powers of charging for gas supplied in parts of the said limits prices exceeding those charged in other parts of those limits.

To prescribe a basic rate of dividend on the ordinary stock of the Company and to empower the Company in certain circumstances to apply their profits in the payment of dividends in excess of the basic rate on the ordinary stock of the Company and in forming or increasing a reserve fund and to make provision for determining from time to time the amount of the profits to be applied as aforesaid.

To repeal Section 23 of the Weston-super-Mare Gas Order 1923 and to confer new powers on the directors of the Company of declaring and paying half-yearly dividends without the sanction or direction of a general meeting of the Company.

To empower the Company or the directors thereof to establish a reserve fund and a renewal fund, to provide for the application of those funds respectively, and to make provision as to the appropriation of the existing reserved fund of the Company and the respective reserve funds and special purposes funds of the Vendors.

The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with its purposes and confer other rights and privileges.

To repeal alter or amend all or any of the provisions of the Weston-super-Mare Gas Acts and Orders 1855 to 1928 and any other Act or Order relating to the Company; the Burnham (Somerset) Gas Order 1910 and any other Act or Order relating to the Burnham Gas Company Limited; the Highbridge Gas Order 1910 and any other Act or Order relating to the Highbridge Gas Company Limited.

To incorporate with the Order all or some of the provisions of the Companies Clauses Consolidation Acts 1845 to 1889, the Gasworks Clauses Act 1847 and the Gasworks Clauses Act 1871.

Any local or other public authority company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 22nd day of January, 1934.

Any such objection shall state:—

- (a) The specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) The omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection must at the same time be forwarded to the undermentioned Solicitor or Parliamentary Agents.
