

east corner of the East Surrey Barracks, thence by a direct line northward to Latchmere Brook, thence continuing northward along the centre of Latchmere Brook to its junction with the boundary of the Borough, thence eastward, north-eastward, south-eastward, north-eastward, south-eastward, eastward and generally southward to the intersection of the Borough boundary with the track of the Southern Railway, thence north-westward and westward along the centre of the track of the said Railway to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Canbury Ward.

"Commencing at a point in the centre of the track of the Southern Railway at its intersection with the western boundary of the Borough, thence northward, north-westward, north-eastward, generally south-eastward, and eastward, following the Borough boundary to its junction with the western boundary of Hill Ward, thence southward, eastward and southward, following the western boundary of Hill Ward as hereinbefore defined to a point immediately over the centre of the track of the Southern Railway, thence westward along the centre of the track of the said Railway to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Norbiton Ward.

"Commencing at a point in the centre of the track of the Southern Railway at the junction of the Borough boundary with the southern boundary of Hill Ward, thence north-westward and westward, following the southern boundary of Hill Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with a point immediately over the centre of Queen Elizabeth Road, thence southward along the centre of Queen Elizabeth Road to its junction with London Road, thence eastward along the centre of London Road to its junction with Hawks Passage, thence southward along the centre of Hawks Passage to its junction with Fairfield Road, thence eastward along the centre of Fairfield Road to its junction with Tiffins School passage, thence southward along the centre of Tiffins School passage to its junction with Fairfield South, thence eastward along the centre of Fairfield South to its junction with Villiers Road, thence southward along the centre of Villiers Road to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence eastward, northward, and generally north-eastward, following the Borough boundary, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Town Ward.

"Commencing at a point on the Borough boundary at its junction with the southern boundary of Canbury Ward, thence eastward following the southern boundary of Canbury Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the western boundary of Norbiton Ward, thence southward following the western boundary of Norbiton Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence generally south-westward, north-westward and northward following the Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Plan Delineating Boundaries.

"The boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated on the Plan annexed hereto which forms part of the Scheme.

"In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

"II.—APPORTIONMENT OF COUNCILLORS.

"The Councillors in office for each Ward as existing at the date of this Scheme shall be the Councillors for the Ward of the same name as altered by this Scheme.

"III.—INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

"1. If any vacancy exists at the date of the Order in Council approving this Scheme or thereafter occurs amongst the existing Councillors, an election to fill the vacancy shall be held for the Ward to which the Councillor whose death or retirement causes the vacancy has been apportioned by this Scheme.

"2. If the register of electors is not so framed as to show the local government electors entitled to vote at an election of Councillors of the Borough to be held for any of the Wards constituted by this Scheme, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk of the Borough to make such alteration or re-arrangement of the register as may be necessary for the purpose of such election.
