

- (c) All edible parts of an animal other than (i) the head or other severed parts of the carcase, (ii) the intestines prepared in the form of sausage casings and (iii) meat which has before importation been made ready for human consumption in the form of a sausage or other prepared or manufactured article of food.

each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition applies only if the label is securely affixed to the meat, or to the package containing the meat, and if the label has not in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion, been used as an Official Certificate.

The label hereby recognised as an Official Certificate for meat imported from Southern Rhodesia is in substitution for the label of which particulars were given in the Schedule to the Notice published in the London Gazette of 29th August, 1933.
