FISHERIES IN THE RIVER LEE.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Lee Conservancy Board in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Lee Con(022)

servancy Acts (1570 to 1921) and of every other authority them in anywise enabling propose to make new Byelaws for the Protection, Preservation and Regulation of the Fisheries in the River Lee, more particularly for the following, among other, purposes, namely, for:—

- (1) Specifying the instruments and apparatus which shall be lawful to use in fishing; and the manner in which they may be used.
 - (2) Prohibiting
 - (a) the taking of fish during the spawning season, under certain lengths, or with unbaited hooks, and
 - (b) the use or possession of any poison for killing fish.
- (3) Specifying the periods during which it shall be illegal to take certain kinds of figh
- (4) Specifying the amount of the penalty for the infringement of any of the Byelaws.
