THE MERCHANDISE MARKS (IMPORTED GOODS) EXEMPTION DIRECTION (No. 1) 1934.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 3, sub-section (2) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3, they have given a Direction in the following terms:—

Whereas it is provided by Article I of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 15 Order, 1933, (a) that it shall not be lawful to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom any imported electrical accessories of the descriptions specified in the said Article unless they bear an indication of origin.

And whereas it is provided *inter alia* by Article 2 (a) of the said Order that the indication of origin shall be die-stamped, impressed, embossed, engraved or moulded on each article:

And whereas the Board of Trade, being the appropriate Department in this case, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter, are satisfied that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 2 (a) of the said Order to goods imported before the tenth day of November, 1933, is likely to cause hardship to the said persons:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3 hereby direct as follows:—

1. Article 2 (a) of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 15 Order, 1933, shall not apply to electrical accessories which were imported before the 10th day of November, 1933, and are sold or exposed for sale
