before the 10th day of August, 1934, and to which an indication of origin is applied as follows:—

(a) stamped or printed on a label securely attached or affixed to each accessory, or

(b) where the accessory forms a distinguishable part of an electric fitting or other article stamped or printed on a label securely attached to that article specifying the accessory which has been imported and indicating its origin.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 1) 1934.

CARDOX CARBON DIOXIDE CARTRIDGES.

The Secretary for Mines gives notice that, under Section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, the Board of Trade have made a new Order, entitled the Explosives in Coal Mines (Cardox) Order, 1934, regulating the use of Cardox Carbon Dioxide Cartridges in mines under the Act.

The general provisions regulating the use of Cardox Cartridges remain unchanged except that

(a) a notice is in future required to be posted in the building where the Cartridges are charged, stating the prescribed charge of liquid carbon dioxide for each type of Cartridge in use, and

(b) the heaters used for priming the Cartridges must in future be marked in a prescribed manner.

These new provisions are intended to ensure (a) that the person who operates the charging plant shall know the proper charge for each type of Cartridge and (b) that the correct type (weight) of heater is used to prime a Cartridge.
