NORTH LONSDALE REGIONAL PLANNING SCHEME.

NOTICE is hereby given that (1) on the first day of February, 1934, the Minister of Health notified his approval of the resolution of the North Lonsdale Joint Town Planning Committee dated the 30th May, 1933, deciding to prepare a Town Planning Scheme under the Town and Country Planning Act, 1932, with reference to an area comprising the Urban Districts of Dalton-in-Furness and Ulverston and the Rural District of Ulverston in the County of Lancaster, and a portion of the Parish of Millom Rural in the Rural District of Bootle in the County of Cumberland. (2) On the 6th day of July, 1931, the Grange-over-Sands Urban District Council passed a resolution, which took effect before the 1st April, 1933, deciding to prepare a Town Planning Scheme for the Grange-over-Sands Urban District, and the District Council subsequently delegated their powers for the preparation of the Scheme to the said Joint Committee. (3) A Map defining the above areas, with the exception of the Grange-over-Sands Urban District, has been deposited at the Office of the Secretary to the Joint Committee, Virginia House, 24, Queen Street, Ulverston, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested, without charge, between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 4 p.m. each weekday, except Saturday, and between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays. The Map relating to the Grange-over-Sands Urban District has been deposited at the Council Offices, Grange-over-Sands, and can be inspected during the same hours.

Any person who is or claims to be an owner of any property in the areas included in the Scheme, and any association representing owners of property within the Urban Districts of Dalton-in-Furness, Ulverston and Grange-over-Sands, and the Rural District of Ulverston, and a portion of the Parish of Millom

Rural in the Rural District of Bootle, and any legal association representing business or industry may by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Joint Committee to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the Scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933," the development of land in the area during the preparation of the Scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order, and in addition the constituent authorities in their respective areas are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the Scheme when approved and in operation.
