WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 5th day of February, 1934 (C.W. 608/34), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council dated the 13th day of August, 1920, it is provided, *inter alia*, that Surgeon Lieutenant Commanders of Your Majesty's Fleet must pass a prescribed Professional Examination to qualify for promotion to the rank of Surgeon Commander and certain regulations are laid down as to the advancement or retirement of these officers conditional upon the result of this examination:

“And whereas circumstances have arisen to prevent a number of Surgeon Lieutenant Commanders of Your Majesty's Fleet who are otherwise eligible for promotion to the rank of Surgeon Commander in 1934 from undergoing

the prescribed Professional Examination and similar circumstances may arise in the future:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to grant us discretionary power to promote Surgeon Lieutenant Commanders to the rank of Surgeon Commander without passing the prescribed professional examination when failure to do so is due to the exigencies of the service or to other causes beyond their own control, provided they are otherwise qualified for promotion.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of February, 1908, the non-substantive rating of Physical and Recreational Training Instructor (formerly Physical Training Instructor) is restricted to ratings above Able Seaman:

"And whereas it is desirable that younger men should be eligible to hold the rating:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve that the non-substantive rating of Physical and Recreational Training Instructor, 2nd Class, be open to Able Seamen.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 22nd day of February, 1934 (C.W. 6766/33), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, to authorize certain allowances for Officers qualified in Physical Training:

"And whereas we consider it desirable to modify the regulations relating to such allowances:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council to approve of the proposals set forth in the accompanying Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"1. Officers of the Royal Navy of the rank or relative rank of Lieutenant or Lieutenant-Commander who, after the 1st January, 1934, undergo a long course of instruction in Physical and Recreational Training and qualify therein or who, having specialised in Physical and Recreational Training prior to that date, we regard as equally qualified, to be paid an allowance of two shillings a day under the following conditions:—

(a) For Officers qualifying after the 1st January, 1934, the allowance to commence with the first appointment after qualifying; for other Officers the allowance to commence as from such date as we may determine; in all cases the allowance to terminate on permanently ceasing to be employed as a specialist in Physical and Recreational Training.

(b) Subject to the foregoing the allowance to be paid continuously while the Officer is borne for full pay otherwise than for duty at the Admiralty.

"2. Officers of the rank of Lieutenant or Captain, Royal Marines, who, after the 1st January, 1934, undergo a long course of instruction in Physical and Recreational Training and qualify therein, or who, having specialised in Physical and Recreational Training prior to that date, we regard as equally qualified, to receive an allowance of two shillings a day when holding definite appointments for Physical and Recreational Training duties afloat or ashore.

"3. Officers of the Royal Navy of the rank or relative rank of Lieutenant or Lieutenant-Commander and Officers of the Royal Marines of the rank of Lieutenant or Captain, who have undergone a short course in Physical and Recreational Training to be paid an allowance of one shilling a day

(a) when holding definite appointments for Physical and Recreational Training duties in certain ships and establishments in which a specialist in such duties is not allowed by complement, or

(b) when holding definite appointments for Physical and Recreational Training duties in certain ships and establishments in which a qualified specialist in these duties is allowed but not borne.

"4. The payment of allowances of one shilling and sixpence a day laid down by Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, to be continued, at our discretion, to Officers at present eligible therefor, but no Officer to draw more than one allowance in respect of Physical and Recreational Training duties."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

**WHEREAS** in pursuance of the Barking Corporation Act, 1933, the boundary of the Borough of Barking will on the first day of April, 1934, be altered so as to include certain areas situate in the Borough of Ilford and the Urban District of Dagenham and parts of the Borough of Barking will be transferred to the said Urban District:

And whereas the said Act was passed on the 28th day of July, 1933:

And whereas by Section 11 of the Barking Corporation Act, 1933, it is provided that on the date of the passing of the said Act the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; as amended by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, and the Borough Councillors (Alteration of Number) Act, 1925, shall have effect as if—

(a) a petition had been presented by the Council praying for an alteration of the number of Councillors of the borough and an alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards thereof and His Majesty had ordered that the same be taken into consideration by His Privy Council; and

(b) the provisions of the said Act altering the boundaries of the borough had come into operation:

And whereas His Majesty by His Order in Council of the 10th day of November, 1933, was pleased to order that as from the 1st day of April, 1934, the number of Councillors of the Borough of Barking shall be twenty-four and that the number of Wards thereof shall be eight:

And whereas on the 22nd day of November, 1933, the Right Honourable Sir John Gilmour, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LL.B., Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the Borough of Barking:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 19th day of February, 1934:—

**"SCHEME FOR DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WARDS OF THE BOROUGH OF BARKING AND APPORTIONING THE COUNCILLORS AMONG THE SAID WARDS IN PURSUANCE OF ORDER IN COUNCIL OF 10TH NOVEMBER, 1933.**

**"I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.**

"In the following descriptions, 'The Borough Boundary' means the boundary of the Borough of Barking as altered by the Barking Corporation Act, 1933.

**"No. 1.—Abbey Ward.**

"Commencing at a point on the north-western boundary of the Borough in the centre of the track of the London Midland and Scottish Railway, thence south-eastward and eastward along the centre of the track of the said Railway to its junction with a direct line

continued northward from the terminus of the line of the house-fronts on the western side of the portion of Lambourne Road which runs north and south, thence southward following the said line and continuing south-eastward by a direct line to a point immediately opposite the centre of the portion of Lambourne Road which runs east and west, and in the centre of the portion of Lambourne Road which runs north and south, thence southward along the centre of Lambourne Road to its junction with Ripple Road, thence westward and north-westward along the centre of Ripple Road to its junction with St. Paul's Road, thence south-westward and north-westward along the centre of St. Paul's Road to its junction with Abbey Road, thence westward across Abbey Road and continuing westward and north-westward along the centre of Town Quay to its junction with Highbridge Road, thence south-westward along the centre of Highbridge Road and continuing along the centre of Six Gates Bridge to a point immediately above the centre of the River Roding, thence south-eastward along the centre of the River Roding to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence westward, north-westward, northward, eastward and northward following the Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

**"No. 2.—Gascoigne Ward.**

"Commencing at a point on the boundary of Abbey Ward at the junction of St. Paul's Road and Ripple Road, thence south-eastward following the boundary of Abbey Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with King Edwards Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of King Edwards Road to its junction with the East Ham and Barking Bypass Road, thence south-westward along the centre of the East Ham and Barking Bye-pass Road to a point immediately above the centre of Barking Creek, thence eastward, southward and south-eastward along the centre of Barking Creek to a point in the centre of Barking Creek Mouth east of Horse End, thence southward by a direct line to the Borough boundary in the River Thames, thence westward, northward, westward, northward, south-westward, southward, north-westward, south-westward, generally northward, generally eastward and north-westward, following the Borough boundary to its junction with the boundary of Abbey Ward, thence north-westward, north-eastward, south-eastward, and north-eastward following the boundary of Abbey Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

**"No. 3.—Eastbury Ward.**

"Commencing at a point at the junction of the centre of the track of the London Midland and Scottish Railway with the eastern boundary of Abbey Ward, thence eastward along the centre of the track of the said London Midland and Scottish Railway to a point immediately under the centre of Lodge Avenue, thence southward and south-westward along the centre of Lodge Avenue and continuing south-westward across Ripple Road and along the centre of the East Ham and Barking Bye-pass Road to a point immediately over the centre of the London Midland and Scottish Railway track, thence south-eastward along the centre of the London Midland and Scottish Railway track to its intersection with

the Borough boundary, thence southward and westward following the Borough boundary to its junction with the boundary of Gascoigne Ward, thence generally northward, westward, north-eastward and north-westward, following the eastern boundary of Gascoigne Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the southern boundary of Abbey Ward, thence eastward and northward following the boundary of Abbey Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" No. 4.—Cambell Ward.*

" Commencing at a point on the Borough boundary at its intersection with Hedgeman's Road, thence southward following the Borough boundary to its junction with the boundary of Eastbury Ward, thence westward and north-eastward following the boundary of Eastbury Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with Woodward Road, thence eastward along the centre of Woodward Road and continuing eastward along the centre of Hedgeman's Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" No. 5.—Parsloes Ward.*

" Commencing at a point on the Borough boundary at its intersection with Porters Avenue, thence southward, generally south-eastward, and southward, following the Borough boundary to its junction with the boundary of Cambell Ward, thence westward following the northern boundary of Cambell Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the boundary of Eastbury Ward, thence northward following the boundary of Eastbury Ward as hereinbefore defined and continuing northward along the centre of Lodge Avenue to its junction with Porters Avenue, thence north-eastward along the centre of Porters Avenue to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" No. 6.—Manor Ward.*

" Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the Borough at its junction with Lodge Avenue, thence eastward and southward following the Borough boundary to its junction with the boundary of Parsloes Ward, thence south-westward and southward following the boundary of Parsloes Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the boundary of Eastbury Ward, thence westward following the boundary of Eastbury Ward as hereinbefore defined to its intersection with Mayes Brook, thence northward along the centre of Mayes Brook to its junction with the Borough boundary in Longbridge Road, thence north-eastward and eastward following the Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" No. 7.—Longbridge Ward.*

" Commencing at a point in the centre of Longbridge Road at its junction with Hulse Avenue, thence north-eastward along the centre of Longbridge Road and continuing north-eastward following the Borough boundary to its junction with the boundary of Manor Ward, thence southward following the western boundary of Manor Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the northern boundary of Eastbury Ward, thence westward following the boundary of Eastbury Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the boundary of Abbey Ward, thence continuing

westward following the northern boundary of Abbey Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with a straight line directly south from the terminus of the centre line of Thornhill Gardens, thence northward following the said line to its junction with the centre line of Thornhill Gardens, thence north-eastward and north-westward along the centre of Thornhill Gardens and continuing north-westward along the centre of Hulse Avenue to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" No. 8.—Park Ward.*

" Commencing at a point on the north-western boundary of the Borough in the centre of the track of the London Midland and Scottish Railway, thence south-eastward and eastward following the northern boundary of Abbey Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the boundary of Longbridge Ward, thence northward, north-eastward, north-westward and north-eastward following the boundary of Longbridge Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence north-westward, north-eastward, northward and generally south-westward, following the Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" Plan Delineating Boundaries.*

" The boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated on the plan annexed hereto which forms part of the Scheme.

" In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

“ III.—INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

“ 1.—(a) The election of the three additional Councillors for Longbridge Ward and the three additional Councillors for Park Ward shall be held on Monday the 26th day of March 1934, or such later date as may be fixed by the Secretary of State.

(b) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme, the elections shall be held in the same manner as elections to fill ordinary vacancies, provided that the Mayor shall be the Returning Officer at the elections, but he may appoint to act as Returning Officer in either of the Wards or in both an Alderman or a Councillor who is not registered as a local government elector in respect of a qualification in that Ward.

(c) The Councillors elected in pursuance of this Scheme shall come into office on the 1st day of April, 1934, and shall go out of office as follows:—

(i) The Councillor who is elected by the smallest number of votes in each of the two Wards, on the 1st November, 1934.

(ii) The Councillor who is elected by the largest number of votes in each of the two Wards, on the 2nd November, 1936.

(iii) The other Councillors on the 1st November, 1935.

“ 2. The election of the two additional Aldermen made necessary by the election of the additional Councillors shall take place at the next meeting of the Council after the 1st day of April, 1934. The additional Aldermen shall come into office immediately after their election and one of the Aldermen so elected shall go out of office on the ordinary day of election of Aldermen in the year 1934, and the Alderman who was elected by the smaller number of votes shall be the Alderman so to retire in the year 1934, and the Alderman who was elected by the greater number of votes shall retire on the ordinary day of election of Aldermen in the year 1937.

“ 3. If for any reason it is doubtful which of the additional Councillors or Aldermen, as the case may be, elected in pursuance of the Scheme, ought to retire in the year specified in this Scheme, the matter shall be determined by lot under the direction of the Mayor or other person presiding at the meeting, at the first or second meeting of the Council after the election of such additional Councillors or Aldermen.

“ 4.—(a) On the day of the election of the additional Aldermen as above provided, the existing Aldermen and the said additional Aldermen shall be respectively assigned by the Council as Returning Officers, until the 9th day of November, 1934, at elections of Councillors for the several Wards of the Borough.

(b) In any Ward in which no Alderman is, in pursuance of this Scheme, assigned for the purpose of acting as Returning Officer at the election of Councillors, the Mayor shall be the Returning Officer, but he may appoint to act as Returning Officer another Alderman or a Councillor not being a Councillor for that Ward and not being registered as a local government elector in respect of a qualification in that Ward.

“ 5. If any vacancy exists at the date of the Order in Council approving this Scheme or thereafter occurs amongst the existing Councillors, an election to fill the vacancy shall

be held for the Ward to which the Councillor whose death or retirement causes the vacancy has been appointed by this Scheme.

“ 6. If the register of electors is not so framed as to show the local government electors entitled to vote at an election of Councillors of the Borough to be held for any of the Wards constituted by this Scheme, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk of the Borough to make such alteration or re-arrangement of the register as may be necessary for the purpose of such election.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means, His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in or over that part of Africa known as the Nyasaland Protectorate (in this Order referred to as “ the Protectorate ”):

And whereas by the Nyasaland Protectorate (Coinage and Currency) Order in Council 1931, (in this Order referred to as the Order of 1931), as amended by the Nyasaland Protectorate (Coinage) Order in Council, 1932, (in this Order referred to as the Order of 1932) the Governor of the Protectorate was empowered to make provision *inter alia* for the use of certain coins as legal tender within the Protectorate:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made for the use of certain coins as legal tender within the Protectorate and that the Order of 1931 amended as aforesaid should be further amended in the manner following:—

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Nyasaland Protectorate (Coinage) Order in Council, 1934, and the Order of 1931 and this Order may be cited together as the Nyasaland (Coinage and Currency) Orders in Council 1931 and 1934.

2. The Order of 1932 is hereby revoked without prejudice to the operation of any regulations made or proclamation issued thereunder or to any other thing lawfully done thereunder.

3. Article 2 of the Order of 1931 is hereby amended by the insertion therein of the words “ cupro-nickel, bronze ” after the word

"silver" in paragraph (1) and of the following paragraph after paragraph (3):—

"(4) With the approval of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury and of a Secretary of State to provide that any coins issued by the Government of the Colony of Southern Rhodesia and declared to be legal tender by that Government within that Colony shall be current in the Protectorate, and that the tender of payment of money in the Protectorate, if made in any of those coins, shall, if the coins have not been illegally dealt with, be a legal tender for any amount not exceeding, in the case of silver coins, two pounds sterling in value, and, in the case of cupro-nickel coins and bronze coins one shilling sterling in value;"

4. For removing doubts it is hereby ordered that the Proclamation issued by the Governor under the Order of 1931 as amended by the Order of 1932, and dated the twenty-ninth day of May one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three shall be deemed to have been lawfully made.

And the Right Honourable Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932 (7 E. 7. c. 29, 4-5 G. 5. c. 18, 9-10 G. 5. c. 80, 18-19 G. 5. c. 3 and 22-23 G. 5. c. 32), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty series No. 16 (1928)) comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas France has acceded to the said Convention on behalf of the French Possessions Overseas:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of the said French Possessions Overseas the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the said French Possessions Overseas or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of the French Possessions Overseas confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the said French Possessions Overseas or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, shall be applicable to the French Possessions Overseas.

3. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (French Possessions Overseas) Order, 1934.

1. This Order may be cited as the "Eastern African Court of Appeal (Amendment) Order in Council, 1934," and shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Order.

2. The Court of Appeal shall exercise such appellate jurisdiction, and such other powers in relation to His Britannic Majesty's Court for Ethiopia as are conferred upon the Court of Appeal by the Ethiopia Order in Council, 1934, or as may from time to time be conferred by any Order in Council amending the said Order.

(ii) On the commencement of this Order the Order in Council bearing date the twenty-second day of August, 1917, entitled "The Nigeria (Privy Council Appeals) Order in Council, 1917" (regulating appeals from the Supreme Court of Nigeria to His Majesty in Council) shall be and the same is hereby revoked and repealed without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder or to the continuation and conclusion thereunder of any appeal to His Majesty in Council pending at the commencement of this Order.

2. The West African (Appeal to Privy Council) Order in Council, 1930, shall have effect as if the Colony and Protectorate of Nigeria were included in the Colonies and other Territories in West Africa mentioned in the preamble to that Order.

3. This Order shall commence and have effect on such day as may be fixed by notification in the London Gazette by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

**W**HEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the first day of November, 1928, and entitled The West African Court of Appeal Order in Council, 1928 (hereinafter called the Principal Order), a Court, called the West African Court of Appeal (in this Order referred to as the Court of Appeal), was constituted for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Majesty's Supreme Courts of the Colonies of the Gold Coast, Sierra Leone, and the Gambia, and from His Majesty's Chief Commissioner's Court of Ashanti, and from His Majesty's Courts in the territories of West Africa known as the Protectorates of Sierra Leone and the Gambia, and the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, and Togoland under British Mandate:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 20th day of January, 1930, and entitled the West African Court of Appeal (Amendment) Order in Council, 1930, the Principal Order was amended in certain respects:

And whereas it is expedient to make further and better provision than that heretofore in force for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Majesty's Supreme Court of Nigeria and to make provision for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Majesty's High Court of the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas it is expedient that for this purpose the Principal Order should be further amended as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the British Settlements Act, 1887, and the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and

with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council, 1934", and shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Order.

2. The Preamble to the Principal Order is hereby amended by inserting after the words "His Majesty's" where they first occur in the Preamble the words "Supreme Court of Nigeria and from His Majesty's" and by inserting after the word "Gambia" where it first occurs the words "and from His Majesty's High Court of the Protectorate of Nigeria".

3. Article 5 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by deleting paragraph (2) thereof and by substituting therefor the following paragraph:—

"(2) The Judges of the Court of Appeal shall be the Judges of the Supreme Court of Nigeria and the Judges of the Supreme Courts of the other Colonies to which this Order applies, and the Judges of the High Court of the Protectorate of Nigeria."

4. Article 6 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the substitution for paragraph (2) thereof of the following:—

"(2) The seniority of the Members of the Court of Appeal shall be determined according to instructions to be given from time to time by the Secretary of State."

5. Article 7 of the Principal Order is hereby revoked and the following Article substituted therefor:—

"7. The Secretary of State may give directions for the appointment of a Registrar and of such other officers of the Court of Appeal as may be necessary."

6. Article 12 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by deleting in paragraph (1) thereof the words "two Judges of the Court of Appeal, of whom the President shall be one", and by substituting therefor the words "the President and the Chief Justice of Nigeria".

7.—(1) In all appeals and proceedings whatsoever which have been fully heard by the Full Court of the Supreme Court of Nigeria, and in which judgment shall not have been given, or, having been given, shall not have been signed, drawn up, or otherwise perfected at the commencement of this Order, any judgment, decree, rule or order may be given or made, signed, drawn up or perfected respectively after the commencement of this Order in the name of the Court from which the Appeal is brought by the Court of Appeal established by the Principal Order, and shall take effect to all intents and purposes as if the same had been duly perfected before the commencement of this Order.

(2) Every judgment, decree, rule, or order of the Court of Nigeria from which the appeal is brought which has been duly perfected at any time before the commencement of this Order, may be executed and enforced and, if necessary, amended or discharged by the Court of Appeal in the same manner as if it had been a judgment, decree, rule or order of the Court of Appeal.

(3) All appeals, matters and proceedings whatsoever, which shall be pending at the

commencement of this Order, shall be continued and concluded before the Court of Appeal according to the form and manner of procedure of the said Court of Appeal.

8. This Order shall commence and have effect on such day as may be fixed by the Secretary of State, published in the London Gazette.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Higham and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Mareston, otherwise Merston, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Martin Linton, Bishop of Rochester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Higham and Mareston, otherwise Merston, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Rochester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Higham and the Parish of the Benefice of Chalk, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Rochester, and the said Bishop of Rochester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Higham is now full, the Reverend James Richard Foster being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Mareston, otherwise Merston, is at present vacant:

"And whereas there is no Church within the limits of the Parish of the said Benefice of Mareston, otherwise Merston:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said James Richard Foster (testified by his signing

this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Higham and the said Benefice of Mareston, otherwise Merston, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Higham with Merston' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Cliffe and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Higham shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Higham shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said James Richard Foster if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Higham shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Higham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the first turn of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union shall belong to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Mareston, otherwise Merston, and the second and every subsequent turn shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Higham.

"6. That with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Rochester, and as such Bishop Patron of the said Benefice of Chalk (testified as aforesaid), and with the consent of the Reverend Alexander William Wesley Bowman, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Chalk (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect all that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Chalk which lies adjacent to the western boundary of the Parish of the said Benefice of Higham shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the United Benefice.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said

Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Rochester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

“ And whereas a sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England by Henry Thomas Clutton Salt Ledsam, of Number 14 Waterloo Street, in the City of Birmingham, chartered accountant, and William Francis Joseph Salt Ledsam, of Hazel Oak, Burman Road, Shirley, in the said County of Warwick, manufacturer, as the personal representatives of the late James Goddington Ledsam, towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church for the said District of Saint Gabriel, Weoley Castle, and we have in respect of the said sum agreed with the said Henry Thomas Clutton Salt Ledsam and William Francis Joseph Salt Ledsam and have undertaken that the said sum of £2,000 shall be disbursed and expended by us in defraying the cost of such Church accordingly:

“ And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Gabriel, Weoley Castle, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas the said Henry Thomas Clutton Salt Ledsam and William Francis Joseph Salt Ledsam have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of

Birmingham as the person to whom they desire that the Patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said District or New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Weoley Castle, should be assigned, and we are satisfied that the said assignment may properly be effected:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Gabriel, Weoley Castle, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And his Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Birmingham.

“ There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the Benefice or Rectory of Huntsham the Parish whereof contains a population of 214 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 175 persons.

“ The net annual value of the Benefice of Huntsham is £230 or thereabouts.

“ There is also in the same County and Diocese the United Benefice or Vicarage of Hockworthy with Holcombe Rogus but the

Parishes of Hockworthy and Holcombe Rogus remain distinct. The Parish of Hockworthy contains a population of 196 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 200 persons.

"The net annual value of the United Benefice of Hockworthy with Holcombe Rogus is £593 or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Vicarage of Bampton the Parish whereof contains a population of 1,467 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 331 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Bampton is £360 or thereabouts.

"That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a portion of the Parish of Hockworthy (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with Pink) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Huntsham to which it is contiguous. Also that a small portion of the Parish of Bampton the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Survey Map annexed hereto and thereon edged with Blue may be advantageously separated therefrom and annexed to the said Parish of Huntsham to which it is contiguous. Furthermore that a small portion of the Parish of Huntsham which is isolated therefrom and is surrounded on all sides by the Parish of Hockworthy boundaries of which are more particularly described in the said Scheme and delineated on the said Ordnance Map and thereon edged with Yellow may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Huntsham and annexed to the said Parish of Hockworthy.

"The Patron of the Benefice of Huntsham is Colonel Gilbert John Acland Troyte, M.P., of Huntsham Court, Devon, and the Reverend Frederick Nash Bird is the Incumbent thereof. The Patron of the United Benefice of Hockworthy with Holcombe Rogus is William Rayer Rayer, Esquire, of Holcombe Court, near Wellington, Somerset, and the Reverend Edward John Barton is the Incumbent thereof. The Patrons of the Benefice of Bampton are The Exeter Diocesan Board of Finance and The Reverend Howard Edmund Frayling is the Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes rent charges and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and

such Consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the said Parishes of Hockworthy and Bampton and annex to the said Parish of Huntsham all those portions of the said Parishes of Hockworthy and Bampton the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance Plan hereto annexed and respectively edged with Pink and Blue.

"That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Huntsham shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portions so to be separated from Hockworthy and Bampton as aforesaid.

"That any inhabitants of such portions shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Huntsham but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Churches of Hockworthy and Bampton respectively.

"That any inhabitants of the aforesaid portions shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Huntsham as they might have had in their Parish Churches of Hockworthy and Bampton respectively.

"That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portions so to be separated from Hockworthy and Bampton respectively shall belong to the Incumbent of Huntsham.

"Furthermore it is proposed to separate from the said Parish of Huntsham and annex to the said Parish of Hockworthy all that part of the said Parish of Huntsham called 'Stallage Thorne' the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance plan hereto annexed and edged with Yellow.

"That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Hockworthy shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated from Huntsham as aforesaid.

"That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Hockworthy but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Huntsham.

"That any inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Hockworthy as they might have had in the Parish Church of Huntsham.

"That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portion so to be separated from Huntsham shall belong to the Incumbent of Hockworthy.

"That the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge specified in the Schedule hereto amounting to the sum of Fifty-three pounds ten shillings and three pence and arising out of lands proposed to be separated from Hockworthy and added to the Parish of Huntsham shall become the property of the Incumbent of Huntsham but the Tithe Rent Charge arising from the lands proposed to be separated from Bampton and added to the Parish of Huntsham shall remain

the property of the Incumbent of Bampton and the Tithe Rent Charge amounting to the sum of Twenty-six pounds fifteen shillings and nine pence which issues out of the Farm called 'Stallenge Thorne' being the lands proposed to be separated from Huntsham and added to the Parish of Hockworthy shall become the property of the Incumbent of Hockworthy.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, on the 21st day of February, 1934, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

ORIEL COLLEGE OXFORD.

A STATUTE to amend a Statute made by the University of Oxford Commissioners acting in pursuance of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5, c. 33), and approved by The King in Council on the 30th day of April, 1926, in relation to Oriel College in the University of Oxford, duly made at a Special General Meeting of the Provost and Fellows of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose, held on the twenty-first day of February, 1934, and passed at such meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted to His Majesty in Council.

Whereas by Statute IV, 1, as made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and approved by The King in Council on the 30th day of April, 1926, in relation to Oriel College in the University of Oxford it was enacted as follows:—

" 1. The number of Open Scholarships in the College the emoluments of which are paid out of the corporate revenues shall not exceed thirty-five, exclusive of Scholarships held for a fifth year, and no more than £4000 shall be paid out in emoluments to Scholars holding such Scholarships in any one year, inclusive of £30 in the case of each Scholar occupying rooms in College free of rent, rates and taxes.

*Provided* that the Provost and Fellows may from time to time increase by Statute the number of the Scholarships in the College and the total sum which may be paid in emoluments to the Scholars."

And whereas by Statute IV, 3 (5), it was enacted as follows:—

" (5) There shall be a Scholarship and Exhibition Fund into which shall be paid annually a sum of not less than £1500 from the corporate revenues of the College and also the annual net income of the Ludwell, the Robinson, the Ireland and the Jackman

Trust Funds and out of which the emoluments of all Scholars and Exhibitors who are not paid direct from Trusts or other Special Funds shall be provided."

And whereas by Statute IV, 5, is was enacted as follows:—

"5. In addition to the Scholarships and Exhibitions provided for in the preceding clauses of this Statute there shall be two Exhibitions, each tenable for two years, to be entitled the Robinson Exhibitions. These Exhibitions shall be open to all Bachelors of Arts in the University who shall not have completed the twenty-first term from their matriculation. The Robinson Exhibitors shall be elected by the Provost and Fellows in such manner as the electors may think fit. They shall pursue such courses of studies as the Provost and Fellows may approve, and shall receive from the Scholarship and Exhibition Fund such sum, being not less than £100 per annum, as the same authorities may determine. The Robinson Exhibitors shall be or shall become members of the College and shall enjoy the same privileges as Members of the College who are Masters of Arts."

And whereas by Statute VII, 1, it was enacted as follows:—

"1. A sum not being less than £10 per cent. of the gross amount of the Tuition Fund shall in every year be carried from that Fund to a separate account and shall form a Fund to be called the Pension Fund."

And whereas the Provost and Fellows are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the said Statutes in manner hereinafter appearing:

We, the said Provost and Fellows of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given to us by the Seventh Section of the said Act alter Statute IV, 1, by substituting for the word "thirty-five" the word "forty";

and Statute IV, 3 (5), by substituting for the sum of "£1500" the sum of "£1000";

and Statute IV, 5, by substituting for the existing clause the following clause:—

"5. In addition to the Scholarships and Exhibitions provided for in the preceding clauses of this Statute there shall be either one or two Senior Scholarships, each tenable for two years, to be entitled the Robinson Senior Scholarships. These Senior Scholarships shall be open to all Bachelors of Arts in the University who shall not have completed the twenty-first term from their matriculation. The Robinson Senior Scholars shall be elected by the Provost and Fellows in such manner as the electors may think fit. They shall pursue such courses of studies as the Provost and Fellows may approve, and shall receive from the Scholarship and Exhibition Fund such sum, being not less than £100 per annum, as the same authorities may determine. The Robinson Senior Scholars shall be or shall become members of the College and shall enjoy the same privileges as Members of the College who are Masters of Arts."

## DEVONSHIRE JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.

78,319.

(27th February, 1934.)

Whereas by the Devonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Order 1931 (in this order referred to as "the order of 1931") the Minister of Health made provision until the 31st day of March, 1934, for the combination of the administrative county of Devon and the county boroughs of Exeter and Plymouth for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casual poor persons by a joint committee named the Devonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid should be continued:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 3 of the Poor Law Act 1930 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Devonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee (Continuance) Order 1934.

(2) The order of 1931 and this order shall be construed together and may be cited as the Devonshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Orders 1931 and 1934.

2. The order of 1931 shall continue in force until the 30th day of September, 1934, unless sooner revoked or otherwise amended.

3. The members of the joint committee who would pursuant to the order of 1931 have gone out of office on the 31st day of March, 1934, shall continue in office and be deemed to have been elected for a period ending on the 30th day of September, 1934.

## MIDDLESEX AND NORTHERN HOME COUNTIES JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.

78,318.

(2nd March, 1934)

Whereas the councils of the counties of Essex, Hertfordshire and Middlesex and of the county boroughs of East Ham, West Ham and Southend-on-Sea consider that it is expedient that the areas of the councils should be combined for such of the purposes connected with the administration of their functions under the Poor Law Act, 1930, as are hereinafter specified, and have made application to the Minister of Health for the purpose:

Now therefore the Minister, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by subsection (1) of section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf makes the following order:—

## SHORT TITLE.

1. This Order may be cited as the Middlesex and Northern Home Counties Joint Vagrancy

Committee Order, 1934, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1934, and unless sooner revoked shall remain in force until the 31st day of March, 1949:

Provided that for the purposes of the proceedings preliminary to the operation of this Order, including proceedings relating to the election of the first members of the Joint Committee, this Order shall operate as from such date earlier than the 1st day of April, 1934, as may be necessary.

#### INTERPRETATION.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“the combined areas” means the counties and county boroughs which are combined by this Order;

“the Joint Committee” means the Middlesex and Northern Home Counties Joint Vagrancy Committee constituted by this Order;

“council” means the council of a county or county borough included in the combined areas, and “councils” means the councils of all the counties and county boroughs so included;

“casual” means any destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief and includes any person admitted into any establishment by a council, or otherwise under the care of a council by way of poor relief, who was, immediately before the date when he was so admitted or came under such care, a destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for, or receiving, poor relief;

“casual ward” means any ward, building, or premises, including the equipment and furniture thereof, set apart or provided for the reception, relief, or employment of casuals;

“special institution” means any ward, building, or premises, including the equipment and furniture thereof, provided by a council with the approval of the Joint Committee solely for the special treatment or training of such casuals as the Joint Committee may deem likely to benefit by such treatment or training;

“the Minister” means the Minister of Health.

#### COMBINATION OF COUNTIES AND COUNTY BOROUGHS AND CONSTITUTION OF JOINT COMMITTEE.

3.—(1) The counties of Essex, Hertfordshire and Middlesex and the county boroughs of East Ham, West Ham and Southend-on-Sea shall be combined for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals within the combined areas.

(2) For the execution of the purpose aforesaid a joint committee of the councils shall be constituted as a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal and shall be known as “The Middlesex and Northern Home Counties Joint Vagrancy Committee.”

#### COMPOSITION OF JOINT COMMITTEE.

4.—(1) The Joint Committee shall consist of ten members, each of whom shall be a member of the council of the county or county borough

and of the public assistance committee of the council by whom he is elected.

(2) Three members shall be elected by the Middlesex County Council; two members by each of the councils of the counties of Essex and Hertfordshire and one member by each of the councils of the county boroughs of East Ham, West Ham and Southend-on-Sea.

#### ELECTION OF MEMBERS.

5.—(1) At the first meeting of each council held after the 15th day of March in the year 1934 and at the first meeting of each council held after the last day of February, 1935, and in every subsequent third year, so long as this order shall continue in force, each of the councils shall elect the number of members of the Joint Committee assigned to them by this order.

(2) Every member of the Joint Committee shall come into office upon his election.

(3) The clerk of each council by whom a member is elected shall forthwith after the election notify the name, address and description of the member—

(a) in the case of the first election to the clerk of the Middlesex County Council; and

(b) in the case of each subsequent election, to the clerk of the Joint Committee.

(4) A council may nominate from amongst members of the council who are members of the public assistance committee of the council a person to act on behalf of a member of the Joint Committee appointed by the council, at any meeting of the Joint Committee at which that member is unable to be present.

(5) The first meeting of the Joint Committee shall be held at such time and place as shall be fixed by the chairman of the Middlesex County Council.

#### PERIOD OF OFFICE.

6.—(1) Except as in this Article otherwise provided, a member of the Joint Committee shall hold office until the date on which his successor is elected.

(2) A member of the Joint Committee who ceases to be a member of the council or a member of the public assistance committee of the council by whom he was elected shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Joint Committee: Provided that a member of the Joint Committee shall not be deemed to have ceased to be a member of the council by whom he was elected or of the public assistance committee if on or before the day on which he goes out of office he has been re-elected a member of the council and of the public assistance committee.

(3) A member of the Joint Committee may resign his membership by sending to the clerk to the Joint Committee notice in writing of his desire to do so, whereupon a casual vacancy shall be deemed to have arisen, and the clerk to the Joint Committee shall forthwith notify the clerk of the council by whom the member was appointed of the vacancy.

(4) A casual vacancy in the membership of the Joint Committee shall be filled as soon as practicable by the election by the council in whose representation the vacancy arises of a new member, and the person so elected shall hold office during the remainder of the term of office of the person in whose place he is elected:

Provided that in the case of a casual vacancy arising not more than two months before the



deceased or outgoing member would normally have gone out of office, it shall not be obligatory upon the said council to fill the vacancy.

#### MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

7. The meetings and proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be conducted in accordance with the rules set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

#### POWERS AND DUTIES OF JOINT COMMITTEE.

8.—(1) It shall be the duty of the Joint Committee from time to time to take into consideration and furnish the Minister with their recommendations in regard to the following matters—

(a) the number and situation of the casual wards and special institutions which should be provided by any council;

(b) the number of casuials for whom accommodation should be provided at any existing casual ward and at any casual ward or special institution proposed to be established in the combined areas;

(c) the closing of any casual ward or special institution in the combined areas.

(2) It shall also be the duty of the Joint Committee to take such steps, whether by public notice or otherwise, as shall be necessary with a view to the repression of begging and sleeping out in the combined area.

(3) Subject to the statutory provisions and orders and regulations for the time being in operation, the Joint Committee may make rules in regard to the administration of casual wards and special institutions within the combined areas, and in particular to the following matters, namely—

(i) times and methods of admission;

(ii) searching;

(iii) bathing, night clothing and bedding;

(iv) smoking;

(v) treatment of sick, aged and infirm casuials;

(vi) treatment of female and child casuials;

(vii) treatment and training of casuials in special institutions;

(viii) dietary;

(ix) discharge and detention; and

(x) tasks;

and any rules so made shall be binding on each of the councils:

Provided that before making any such rules the Joint Committee shall notify the councils concerned of their proposals relating thereto and shall give a reasonable opportunity to every such council to make representation to the Joint Committee regarding the proposals.

(4) The Joint Committee shall also have power with the approval of the Minister, to contribute by way of an annual subscription towards the support and maintenance of any association or institution which appears to the Joint Committee to be calculated to render useful aid in the administration of the relief of casuials:

Provided that no single subscription in excess of £100 shall be made to any association or institution, unless the Joint Committee have given notice to each of the councils of their intention to make application to the Minister for his approval, and if a majority of the councils object to the proposal the application shall not be made.

(5) Nothing in this Order shall affect the powers and duties conferred or imposed on any of the councils in their capacity as a poor law authority, or shall deprive or relieve any of the councils of their powers, duties and obligations with reference to the relief of casuials, except so far as any such powers, duties or obligations are being exercised, undertaken or discharged by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order.

#### PAYMENTS BY JOINT COMMITTEE TO COUNCILS.

9.—(1) The Joint Committee shall in respect of each period of account pay to each of the councils—

(a) the expenses (calculated as hereinafter provided) incurred by the council during the accounting period on the provision or extension of any casual ward which is used for the accommodation of casuials in accordance with any requirement of the Minister;

(b) a sum (calculated as hereinafter provided) in respect of each casual relieved by the council during the accounting period in a casual ward provided by the council in accordance with any requirement of the Minister;

(c) a sum (calculated on the basis of such daily rate for each person relieved as may be arranged between the Joint Committee and the council) payable in respect of the relief provided by the council to any casual in an establishment belonging to or utilised by the council other than a casual ward or special institution;

(d) the net expenses incurred by the council during the accounting period in the maintenance of any special institution provided by the council with the approval of the Minister and of the Joint Committee, including any loan charges or rent payable by the Council in respect of the institution, and in the maintenance, treatment and training of the casuials therein;

(e) the cost of any surgical appliances supplied by the council to casuials during the accounting period.

(2) The expenses incurred by a council under sub-paragraph (a) of the preceding paragraph shall be calculated as follows:—

(i) in the case of a casual ward erected, or an extension of an existing casual ward made, after the commencement of this order, the expenses shall be taken to be 5 per cent. of the capital expenditure incurred in providing and equipping the ward or the extension, as the case may be;

(ii) in any other case the expenses shall be taken to be 5 per cent. of the value of the casual ward as estimated by a person to be nominated jointly by the council and the Joint Committee or in default of a joint nomination to be nominated by the Minister.

(3) The sum payable to a council under sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) of this Article shall be determined by the Joint Committee in respect of each accounting period by reference to the average cost throughout the previous accounting period of maintaining a casual for a night in all the casual wards of the combined areas, the cost of maintenance being treated for this purpose as including the cost of repairs and management and establishment charges but not loan charges.

SEALING OF DOCUMENTS.

10. The seal of the Joint Committee shall be affixed in the presence of the chairman or two other members of the Joint Committee and of the clerk of the Joint Committee.

EXPENSES OF JOINT COMMITTEE.

11. A fund shall be established, to be called the joint fund, to which all moneys received by the Joint Committee shall be carried and from which all expenses incurred by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order shall be defrayed.

APPORTIONMENT OF EXPENSES AND CONTRIBUTION ORDERS.

12. Each of the councils shall make contributions to the joint fund in the manner provided in this Article—

(1) For the purpose of calculating the contributions, the expenses of the Joint Committee shall be divided into two equal portions.

(2) In order to obtain contributions to meet one half of their expenses, the Joint Committee shall at quarterly intervals make orders on each council for the payment to the Joint Committee by the council on the dates mentioned in the orders of the amount produced by a rate of the amount in the pound specified in the order (that amount being the same in all the orders made at any one time on the councils) and levied in the area of the council, and the council shall make payments to the Joint Committee in accordance with the requirements of the order.

(3) For the purpose of enabling the Joint Committee to make such orders as aforesaid each council shall before the 1st day of March in each year transmit to the Joint Committee an estimate of the amount which will be produced in the following accounting period by a rate of one penny in the pound levied in the area of the council.

(4) The estimate mentioned in paragraph (3) of this Article shall be made and the amount due under an order of the Joint Committee shall be calculated in the manner prescribed in the Product of Rates and Precepts Rules, 1929\*, and so far as they are applicable any rules amending or superseding those rules:

Provided that in the application of the provisions of those rules to this Order references to a precepting authority, a precept, a rating authority, and a rating area shall be read respectively as references to the Joint Committee, an order of the Joint Committee, a council, and the area of a council.

(5) In order to obtain contributions to meet the other half of their expenses, the Joint Committee shall at quarterly intervals make orders on each council for the payment to the Joint Committee by the council on the dates mentioned in the orders of amounts based on the following apportionment:—

(6) Orders made by the Joint Committee under this Article shall be based on the provisional claims submitted quarterly to the Joint Committee by the councils under paragraph (3) of the next succeeding Article.

(7) Any sum due under an order of the Joint Committee shall be a debt due from the council to whom the order is addressed and may be recovered accordingly.

ESTIMATES, ACCOUNTS AND PAYMENTS.

13.—(1) The accounting period shall be from the 1st day of April in any year to the 31st day of March in the following year.

(2) The Joint Committee shall, as soon as possible after the commencement of the first accounting period, and not later than the 15th day of November before the commencement of each subsequent accounting period, transmit to each of the councils an estimate of the probable expenditure of the Joint Committee during that period together with an estimate of the amount which will be payable by each of the councils in respect of that period, and shall from time to time transmit to each of the councils such revised or other estimates as may become necessary.

(3) The councils shall submit their provisional claims to the Joint Committee quarterly, and the Joint Committee shall settle such claims quarterly.

(4) As soon as possible after the end of the accounting period each of the councils shall prepare and transmit to the Joint Committee an account of the total expenses which they have incurred during the period in respect of which they claim repayment from the Joint Committee, and the Joint Committee shall thereupon prepare and transmit to each council a statement showing the expenses of the Joint Committee over the said period, and the balance due to or from each of the councils.

(5) Any amount due to be paid by the Joint Committee to any of the councils, shall be certified from time to time by the chairman of the Joint Committee, or the chairman of the meeting of the Joint Committee at which such amount is approved, and countersigned by the clerk of the Joint Committee, and may be recovered as a debt due to the council.

APPLICATION OF STATUTES AND ORDERS.

14.—(1) The statutory provisions and the orders and regulations of the Minister and his predecessors for the time being applicable to a council by reason of their being a poor law authority shall, so far as they are consistent with the provisions of this order, apply to the Joint Committee as if the Joint Committee were a council of a county or county borough exercising poor law functions, and as if the combined areas were the area of such a council.

(2) The accounts of the income and expenditure of the Joint Committee and of their sub-committees and officers shall be made up and audited in like manner and subject to the same provisions as the accounts of a county council, and the enactments relating to the audit of those accounts and to all matters incidental thereto or consequential thereon (including the penal provisions of those enactments) shall apply and have effect as if they were herein re-enacted and in terms made applicable:

Provided that prior to audit a copy of the abstract of accounts shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils.

(3) The said accounts and all minute books of the Joint Committee and their sub-committees shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection and transcription without payment by any member of any of the councils or by any officer of any of the councils authorised by that council for that purpose.

(4) A copy of the auditor's report and of the abstract of the accounts of the Joint Committee, when duly audited, shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils within one month after the completion of the audit of the accounts of the Joint Committee.

(5) Nothing contained in this Article shall be deemed to confer on the Joint Committee any power of raising money by loan for the purposes of this Order.

#### JOINT COMMITTEE TO SEND COPIES OF MINUTES TO COUNCILS.

15. The Joint Committee shall from time to time send to the councils and to each member of the Joint Committee a copy of the minutes of their proceedings or an abstract thereof.

#### FIRST CLERK OF JOINT COMMITTEE.

16. The Clerk for the time being of the Middlesex County Council shall be the Clerk of the Joint Committee for a period of one year from the commencement of this order or such longer period as may elapse before his successor is appointed.

#### SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES.

17. In the event of any dispute arising in connection with the provisions of this Order between any of the councils and the Joint Committee, or between any two or more councils, the dispute may, on the application of any one or more of the parties affected be referred to the Minister, and the Minister may, at his option, either decide the dispute himself or appoint some other person to decide it, and in the latter event the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1889, and of any enactment amending that Act shall apply as though the person appointed by the Minister were a single arbitrator appointed by consent of the parties.

#### FINANCIAL ADJUSTMENTS ON EXPIRATION OF ORDER.

18. Upon the expiration of this Order the Joint Committee and the councils may make agreements for the purpose of adjusting any property, income, debts, liabilities and expenses of, and any financial relation between, the parties to the agreement, and Section 151 of the Local Government Act, 1933, shall apply as if this Order were an order made under Part VI of that Act.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### RULES AS TO MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

1.—(1) The Joint Committee shall in every year hold an annual meeting and at least three other meetings which shall be as near as may be at regular intervals for the transaction of general business.

(2) The first meeting held in each period of account shall be the annual meeting.

2. Subject to the provisions of this order, the Joint Committee may make standing orders for the regulation of their proceedings and business and may vary or revoke any such orders.

3. No business shall be transacted at a meeting of the Joint Committee unless at least four members are present thereat.

4.—(1) The Joint Committee shall at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be chairman, and the chairman shall unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until his successor is appointed.

(2) The Joint Committee may at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be vice-chairman who shall, unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until immediately after the election of the chairman at the next annual meeting.

5.—(1) At a meeting of the Joint Committee the chairman, if present, shall preside.

(2) If the chairman is absent from a meeting of the Joint Committee the vice-chairman, if present, shall preside.

(3) If both the chairman and vice-chairman of the Joint Committee are absent, such member of the Joint Committee as the members present shall choose shall preside.

6.—(1) Every question at a meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting on that question.

(2) In the case of an equality of votes, the person presiding at the meeting shall have a second or a casting vote.

7.—(1) Minutes of the proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be drawn up and entered in a book kept for the purpose, and shall be signed at the same or next ensuing meeting of the Joint Committee by the person presiding thereat, and any minute purporting to be so signed shall be received in evidence without further proof.

(2) Until the contrary is proved, a meeting of the Joint Committee in respect of the proceedings whereof a minute has been so made and signed shall be deemed to have been duly convened and held, and all the members present at the meeting shall be deemed to have been duly qualified.

8. The proceedings of the Joint Committee shall not be invalidated by any vacancy among their number or by any defect in the election or qualification of any member thereof.

9. The clerk or any authorised officer of a council may attend the meeting of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof and may speak but not vote thereat.

5. To prescribe the maximum price or prices that may be demanded by the Corporation in respect of any supply of electricity in the added area.

6. To authorise the Corporation to break up in the added area, streets and parts of streets which are not repairable by the local authority and to exercise within the added area all powers usually conferred upon distributors of electricity.

7. To provide for the submission by the Corporation to the Electricity Commissioners of proposals for the development of the supply of electricity in the added area and to empower the Commissioners to make an Order that the streets and parts of streets throughout which distributing mains are to be laid down in pursuance of such proposals subject to any modifications or additions are to be deemed to be the streets and parts of streets throughout which the Corporation are to lay down distributing mains for the purpose of section 21 of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899.

8. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1933, and the enactments incorporated therewith and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.
