SUBJECT.

Contraction of the Yorkshire (North Riding) Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

Substitutes on the 4th April, 1934, the following Area for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1934 (No. 1).

An Area comprising:—

In the county of the North Riding of Yorkshire.

The parishes of Appleton, Killerby, Hornby, Hackforth, Ainderby Miens with Holtby,

Kirkby Fleetham, Thrintoft, Akebar, Patrick Brompton, Langthorne, Scruton, Newton-le-Willows, Crakehall, Rand Grange, Aiskew, Morton-upon-Swale, Warlaby, Rookwith, Burrill with Cowling, Thirn, Thornton Watlass, Bedale, Firby, Exelby Leeming and Newton, Gatenby, Clifton-upon-Ure, Snape, Well, Theakston, Burneston, Carthorpe, and Swainby with Allerthorpe; so much of the parishes of Maunby and Newby Wiske as lies to the west of the railway joining Pickhill Station to Northallerton Station; and so much of the parish of Burton-upon-Ure as lies to the north of the road which runs from Masham via Low Burton and Mowbray Hill to Nosterfield.
