2. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army and Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and except Officers of the Indian Services and Indian Army and Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

All Officers on the active, retired and reserve lists of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers on the active list of the Royal Air Force and Officers of the Special Reserve and Auxiliary Air Force will obtain their cards, for attendance or presentation, through the usual channels. Officers of the Reserve of Air Force Officers and Officers on the retired list of the Royal Air Force will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Secretary, Air Ministry, Kingsway, W.C.2.

6. All Officers of His Majesty's Civil Service will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.

7. All Officers of the Indian Services and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and otbain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Political A.D.O. to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

8. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Ceremonial and Reception Secretary, Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 18th May, 1934, at 1 o'clock for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,600.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 22nd May, 1934, to Saturday, the 26th May, 1934, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

#### Whitehall, April 30, 1934.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Douglas Hubert Ormond Bishop, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances :--

On the 5th February, 1934, a heavy fall of roof took place at a point in the workings at the Langwith Colliery, Derbyshire. A stallman was buried under the fallen material but was saved from fatal injury because he was beneath a girder, one end of which remained in position and the other on some of the fallen material. Mr. Bishop, who is the manager of the colliery, took charge of the rescue measures and undertook the most dangerous part of the work. He first raised one end of the girder with a coal-cutter's jack and then (largely with his hands) scraped away the ground from the imprisoned man's feet and hip. After a good deal of manoeuvring the stallman, whose left leg had been fractured, was released. The release took a considerable time and Mr. Bishop was exposed to great risk for an hour and a half. At any time a further fall might have occurred which would have proved fatal to Mr. Bishop and the imprisoned man.


TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting:

Whereas a new Church has lately been built within the Parish of Stainforth, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, and has been consecrated and is known as the Church of Saint Mary, Stainforth.

And whereas the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Stainforth, and the Reverend William Stephen Fletcher, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Vicarage of the Parish of Stainforth, have by an Instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the twentieth day of April, in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said Parish of Stainforth that the said new Church of Saint Mary, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (known as the Church of Saint Matthew) of the same parish.

Now therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do by this Instrument under our Common Seal, with the consent (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, and of the said William Stephen. Fletcher, hereby declare that the said new Church of Saint Mary, situate within the said Parish of Stainforth and duly consecrated as afore-said, shall be and the same is hereby substituted for the said old parish church of the same parish, and that such new Church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said Parish of Stainforth in lieu of the said old parish church of the same parish as fully in all respects as if the said new Church of Saint Mary, so hereby substituted, had been origin-ally the parish church of the same parish: And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church of the said Parish of Stainforth or of or belonging to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, to the said new Church of Saint Mary (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said Parish of Stainforth) and to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof and his successors for ever.

#### URBAN DISTRICT OF BARRY.

MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1894.

BYE-LAWS AS TO SEAMEN'S LODGING HOUSES.

#### 1894, it is enacted as follows :----

#### \* \* \* Part II.

#### MASTERS AND SEAMEN.

PROTECTION OF SEAMEN FROM IMPOSITION.

\* \* \* \* \*

214 (1).—A local authority hereinafter mentioned whose district includes a seaport, may, with the approval of the Board of Trade, make bye-laws relating to Seamen's Lodging Houses

in their district, and those bye-laws shall be binding upon all persons keeping houses in which seamen are lodged and upon the owners thereof and persons employed therein.

(2).—The bye-laws shall amongst other things provide for the licensing, inspection, and sanitary conditions of Seamen's Lodging Houses, for the publication of the fact of a house being licensed, for the due execution of the bye-laws, for preventing the obstruction of persons engaged in securing that execution, for the preventing of persons not duly licensed holding themselves out as keeping or purporting to keep licensed houses, and for the exclusion from licensed houses of persons of improper character, and shall impose sufficient fines not exceeding Fifty Pounds for the breach of any bye-law.

\* \* \* \* \*

(7).—In this section the expression "local authority" means . . . the local authority under the Public Health Acts . . . and the expression "district" means the area under the authority of such local authority.

\* \* \* \* \*

The Urban District Council of Barry being the local authority under the Public Health Act, in and for the said Urban District, do hereby at a Meeting held on the twelfth day of February, 1934, make the following bye-laws:—

1.—In these bye-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the masculine pronoun includes the feminine, and the singular includes the plural, and the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

"Council" means the Urban District Council of Barry;

"Seaman" means any male person other than the holder of a certificate of competency or service as Master, Mate, or Engineer in the Merchant Service, who is ordinarily employed in any capacity whatsoever on board ship;

"Licence" means a licence granted or which may be granted by the Council in pursuance of these bye-laws to a person authorising him to keep the house specified therein as a Seamen's Lodging House; "Licensed Keeper" means a person to whom

"Licensed Keeper" means a person to whom a licence has been granted in pursuance of these bye-laws; "Keeper" means and includes both a

"Keeper" means and includes both a licensed keeper and a person who keeps a Seamen's Lodging House or a house in which Seamen are lodged to whom a licence has not been granted in pursuance of these bye-laws;

"Licensed House" means a Seamen's Lodging House in respect of which a licence has been granted in pursuance of these bye-laws;

"House" means and includes both a licensed house and a Seamen's Lodging House or a house in which Seamen are lodged, in respect of which a licence has not been granted in pursuance of these bye-laws;

Where any reference is made in these byelaws to the Clerk, or any other official, such reference shall be deemed to be a reference to the Clerk, or other official, as the case may be, of the Urban District Council of Barry.

2.—A person who shall apply to the Council for a licence shall furnish, on the application form to be supplied by the Council, a true statement of the particulars therein required to be specified.

3.-A person who, not being duly licensed, shall himself or by means of any agent or servant hold himself out as keeping or purporting to keep a licensed house, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, and to a further penalty of ten pounds for every day during which he shall continue to do so after conviction for so doing.

4.—A licence shall continue in force (subject to suspension or revocation as in these byelaws provided) for such period as the Council may determine, and shall be subject to such conditions specified therein or endorsed thereon, and not being inconsistent with the laws, bye-laws, or regulations for the time being in force in the Urban District of Barry, as the Council sees fit and a licensed keeper, or any person employed in a licensed house, shall not commit a breach of, or fail to observe, such conditions.

5.—A house shall not be licensed as a Seamen's Lodging House until it has been inspected and approved for the purpose by the Medical Officer of Health; and the Council may, if they think fit, require any person who applies for a licence to produce to the Council a certificate from the Chief Police Officer in the Urban District of Barry to the effect-

(a) that, so far as is known, he is a fit and proper person to have charge of a licensed house, or

(b) that, so far as is known, no conviction militating against his competency for the charge of a licensed house has been registered against him in any Police Court within three years immediately preceding such application.

6.—The Council shall cause to be kept a Register of all licences granted under these Bye-laws, and the suspension or revocation of any licence shall be noted in that Register.

7.—A licence shall not be granted to a person who holds a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor, or who is engaged or interested in the business of a Clothier, Outfitter, or Slopdealer; nor shall a licence be granted in respect of any house where intoxicating liquor is sold, nor in respect of any house occupied or used for the purpose of the business of a Clothier, Outfitter, or Slop-dealer; nor shall any licensed keeper sell or be engaged or interested in the sale of intoxicating liquor, nor be engaged or interested in the business of a Clothier, Outfitter, or Slop-dealer.

-A licence shall not be transferable, and no licensed keeper shall transfer or lend the same to any other person.

9.-If a licensed keeper is convicted for any felony, misdemeanour, or offence against any of these bye-laws, or if the Council is satisfied that a licensed keeper has been guilty of a breach of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, or any Acts amending the same, or of an offence under the Aliens Order, 1920, or that a licensed keep or any person employed in his licensed house has permitted drunkenness, gambling, or immoral or fraudulent practice in a licensed house, or has admitted into, harboured, or allowed to remain in, or has neglected to exclude or remove from, a licensed house any thief, reputed thief, prostitute, reputed prostitute, or any person of known immoral or improper character who may be in a licensed house, the Council may suspend for

such period as the Council think fit, or revoke, such licensed keeper's licence,

Within seven days after suspension or revocation of a licence the licensed keeper shall deliver his licence to the Clerk, but at the expiration of a period of suspension the licence shall be returned to the licensed keeper.

10.-The Medical Officer of Health, the Senior Sanitary Inspector, any Superintendent or Inspector of the Police Force, any Detective Officer or Police Constable generally or specially authorised for the purpose, any Officer of the Board of Trade, and any other person generally or specially authorised by the Council for the purpose, may at all times, whatsoever, of the day or night enter and inspect any house, and also inspect the Register of Seamen Lodgers hereinafter referred to; and every keeper and every person employed in a house shall give, and cause to be given, every such Officer, Inspector, and all persons aforesaid, free access to his house at all such times aforesaid.

11.-No licensed keeper shall admit to, or suffer to occupy, any bedroom in his house a greater number of lodgers than that from time to time fixed by the Council, or any Committee thereof authorised in that behalf, and this number shall be legibly painted upon the inner side of each bedroom door, with the prefix "Licensed for " and the affix

" Lodgers."

12.—Whenever the Council shall consider it necessary to reduce the number of lodgers to be received in any bedroom in any licensed house, the licensed keeper of the house shall, upon receiving notice in writing to that effect under the hand of the Clerk to the Council, cease to permit such room to be occupied by any greater number of lodgers than that speci-fied in such notice.

13.-No licensed keeper shall permit any kitchen, scullery, sitting-room, or any room in his house below the ground level to be used as a bedroom.

14.-Every licensed keeper shall cause the windows of every bedroom in his house to be kept open between the hours of ten and twelve in the forenoon, or between the hours of two and four in the afternoon, unless prevented by the inclemency of the weather, or the illness of any inmate of such room.

15.-Every licensed keeper shall cause the floors of every room in his house to be thoroughly swept before the hour of ten in the forenoon daily, and all floors which are not covered with carpet to be well and sufficiently washed on Friday in each week, before the hour of twelve noon.

16.-Every licensed keeper shall cause all bed-clothes and bedding, and every bedstead used in his house to be thoroughly cleansed, from time to time, as often as shall be requisite for the purpose of keeping such bedclothes, bedding, and bedstead in a clean and wholesome condition.

17.-Every licensed keeper shall cause the bed-clothes of every bed in his house to be removed from such bed as soon as conveniently may be after such bed shall have been vacated by any lodger, and shall cause all such bedclothes, and the bed from which such bedclothes may have been removed, to be freely exposed to the air for one hour at least in the forencon or for one hour at least in the afternoon of every day.

18.—Every licensed keeper shall cause every room which may be appointed for use and occupation as a sleeping apartment in his house to be furnished with such number of beds and bedsteads and with such a supply of bed-clothes as may be sufficient for the requirements of the number of lodgers authorised to be received into such room, and he shall cause every sleeping apartment to be furnished with bedsteads and bedding of a size adapted for one person only.

19.—No licensed keeper nor any person employed in a house shall permit or suffer more than one lodger to occupy or sleep in the same bed.

20.—Every licensed keeper shall for the use of the lodgers received into his house, cause to be provided a sufficient number of basins or other receptacles for water, of adequate capacity and suitably placed, and a sufficient supply of water, and a sufficient number of towels for use in connection with such basins or other receptacles. He shall cause such basins or receptacles to be kept clean and in good order, and the supply of towels to be renewed, from time to time, as often as may he requisite.

21.—Every licensed keeper shall cause all solid or liquid filth or refuse to be removed once at least in every day before the hour of ten in the forenoon from every room in his house, and shall once at least in every day cause every vessel, utensil, or other receptacle for such filth or refuse to be thoroughly cleansed.

22.—In the event of any inmate of a licensed house whether a lodger or otherwise, being attacked by any infectious disorder, the licensed keeper of such house shall forthwith give intimation of the same to the Medical Officer of Health.

23.—Every licensed keeper immediately after he shall have been informed or shall have ascertained that any lodger in his house is ill of any infectious disease, shall adopt all such precautions as may be necessary to prevent the spread of such infectious disease.

Such licensed keeper shall not, at any time while such lodger is suffering from such infectious disease, cause or allow any other person, except the wife, mother, daughter, father or son of such lodger, or except a person voluntarily in attendance on such lodger, to use or occupy the same room as such lodger.

Where, in pursuance of the statutory provision in that behalf the Council may order the removal of such lodger to a hospital or other place for the reception of the sick, such licensed keeper, on being informed of such order, shall forthwith take all such steps as may be requisite on his part to secure the safe and prompt removal of such lodger in compliance with the order of the Council, and shall, in and about such removal, adopt all such precautions as, in accordance with any instructions which he may receive from the Medical Officer of Health, may be most suitable for the circumstances of the case.

Where, in consequence of the illness of such lodger, there may be reasonable grounds for apprehending the spread of infection through the admission of lodgers to any room or rooms in such house or through the admission to such room or rooms of the maximum number of lodgers authorised to be received therein, such licensed keeper after being furnished with the necessary instructions from the Medical Officer of Health, and until the grounds for apprehending the spread of infection shall have been removed, shall cease to receive any lodger in such room or rooms or shall receive therein such number of lodgers, being less than the maximum number, as the exigencies of the case may require.

Such licensed keeper shall immediately after the death, removal, or recovery of any lodger who may have been ill of any infectious disease, give written notice thereof to the Medical Officer of Health, and shall, as soon as conveniently may be cause every part of the room which may have been occupied by such lodger to be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, and shall also cause every article in such room which may be liable to retain infection to be in like manner cleansed and disinfected unless the Council shall have ordered the same to be destroyed.

He shall comply with all instructions of the Medical Officer of Health as to the proper cleansing and disinfection of the room and articles.

When the same shall have been thoroughly cleansed and disinfected in accordance with such instructions, he shall give written notice thereof to the Medical Officer of Health; and, until two days from the giving of such notice shall have elapsed, and unless and until by such cleansing and disinfection the necessary precautions for preventing the spread of disease shall have been duly taken, such keeper shall not cause or suffer any other lodger to be received into the room which, in the case hereinbefore specified may have been exposed to infection.

24.—Every licensed keeper shall provide sufficient and proper water-closet accommodation in his house for the separate use of lodgers in the proportion of one such closet to every 12 or fractional part of 12 persons in such house. He shall cause all water-closets in his house and every part of the apparatus of such water-closets, to be kept clean, and shall cause the same and every drain or means of drainage with which they or either of them may communicate, to be maintained in good order and efficient condition.

25.—Every licensed keeper shall cause all such means of ventilation as may be provided in or in connection with any room, passage or staircase in his house, and in, or in connection with any water-closet or urinal belonging to his house to be maintained at all times in good order.

26.—Every licensed keeper shall cause every part of the structure of his house to be maintained at all times in good order and repair.

tained at all times in good order and repair. 27.—Every licensed keeper shall cause the yard, area, forecourt, or other open space within the curtilage of his house to be maintained at all times in good order and thoroughly clean and free from any accumulation of filth or other refuse.

28.—Every licensed keeper and every person employed in his house shall not receive any female lodger into such house.

29.—Every licensed keeper shall put up or affix and keep up or affixed a copy of these bye-laws in a suitable and conspicuous position

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in the common sitting-room of his house, in such a manner that the contents of such copy may be clearly and distinctly visible and legible, and shall enter upon the space left for the purpose at the end of that copy a scale

for the purpose at the end of that copy a scale of the charge per day for board, lodging and necessaries to be made by him; and he shall not make a higher charge than is provided by the scale on any pretence whatever.

He shall not, at any time, conceal, deface, alter, or obliterate or permit or suffer to be concealed, defaced, altered, or obliterated any part of the contents of such copy, or injure or destroy such copy.

30.—Every licensed keeper shall keep a Register in which he shall enter the name, age, and nationality of every seaman lodger received into his house, the name of the last vessel such seaman lodger was discharged from, and the port of discharge, together with the name and port of registry of any vessel he may join while resident in such house, or his declared destination on leaving.

31.—Every licensed keeper shall affix and keep affixed and undefaced, in the most conspicuous place on the outside of the main entrance from any street to his licensed house a notice consisting of the following words:—

#### "SEAMEN'S LICENSED LODGING HOUSE "

(Name of Licensed Keeper to be inserted here).

#### "LICENSED KEEPER."

And also the full name of the licensed keeper, as shewn above, in legible and durable capital printed letters not less than one inch square.

32.—No person shall obstruct any officer or person engaged in securing the execution of these bye-laws.

33.—No person other than a licensed keeper, whose licence has not been suspended or revoked, shall by means of any agent, servant, sign, notice, inscription, ticket, placard, advertisement, circular, letter, document, word of mouth, or by any other ways or means howsoever, hold himself out as keeping or purporting to keep a licensed house.

34.—No licensed keeper nor any person employed in his house shall admit into or harbour in nor allow to remain in nor neglect to exclude from his licensed house any thief, reputed thief, prostitute, reputed prostitute, or

any other person of immoral or improper character.

35.—Every person who shall offend against or commit a breach of any of the foregoing bye-laws except when otherwise expressly provided shall be liable for every such offence or breach to a penalty not exceeding TEN POUNDS.

36.—These bye-laws shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1934, and as from such date all bye-laws hitherto in force relating to seamen's lodging houses in the said Urban District shall be revoked and cease to have effect except so far as relates to any offence committed against or to any penalty incurred under such bye-laws.

37.—These bye-laws may be cited as the "Barry Seamen's Lodging Houses Bye-laws, 1934."

The Common Seal of the Urban District Council of Barry was, pursuant to a resolution passed at a meeting of the Council (L.S.) held on the twelfth day of February, 1934, hereunto affixed this twenty-fifth day of April, 1934, in the presence of
