MARKETING SCHEME.

Notice is hereby given that a scheme for the regulation of the marketing of sugar beet under the Agricultural Marketing Acts, 1931 and 1933, has been duly submitted to the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland. The scheme is applicable to Great Britain.

Every objection must be made in writing, and must state the grounds of objection and the specific modifications required.
