INSTRUMENT substituting the new Church of Saint Mary, situate within the Parish of Stainforth, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, for the old Church of Saint Matthew, situate within and hitherto being the parish church of the same parish.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting:

Whereas a new Church has lately been built within the Parish of Stainforth, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, and has been consecrated and is known as the Church of Saint Mary, Stainforth.

And whereas the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Stainforth, and the Reverend William Stephen Fletcher, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Vicarage of the Parish of Stainforth, have by an Instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the twentieth day of April, in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said Parish of Stainforth that the said new Church of Saint Mary, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (known as the Church of Saint Matthew) of the same parish.
