Lisbon, May 29. N. S.

THe Levies for the 5 Regiments of Foot, and 25 Troops of Horse, for which the King of Portugal has lately given out Commissions, go on with good Success; and they continue likewise to fit our several Men of War here and at Oporto. The President Rouille, Ambassador from France, had Audience of the King and Queen the 25th instant; and Complimented them on the Prince their second Son's entring into the 7th year of his Age: And on this occasion they likewise received the Compliments of the other Foreign Minister's residing here.

Messina, June 6. The Muscovite General Szezemet is lately come hither from Maltha, where he was very well received by the Great Master of that Order, who presented him with a Golden-Cross set with Diamonds, to the value of about 6000 Crowns, and sent two Gallies to Convoiy him as far as Cape Passaro. We hear, the Gallies of Maltha are Cruising on the Coast of Barbary.

Rome, June 14. The Marquis of Leganez, late Governor of Milan, arrived here yesterday, and is Lodged at the House of the Spanish Ambassador. He designs in a few days to go to Terracina, where he is to meet the Duke of Medina Celi, Viceroy of Naples. The Congregation of Cardinals, which the Pope appointed some time ago to Examine the Archbishop of Cambray's Book, have had several Meetings about it, but are come as yet to no Resolution thereupon. The Prince of Hesse Darmstadt, who has continued some time in this City, is on his departure for Vienna. The Pope has given Orders, That his Gallies should sail forthwith for the Levant, to joyn the Venetian Fleet.

Genova, June 14. Signior Giovanni Antonio Justiniani, who is appointed Envoy Extraordinary from this Republick to His Majesty of Great Britain, and Signior Agostino Centurione, who goes with the like Character to France, having received their Instructions, left this place last Thursday to repair to their respective Stations.

Venice, June 20. The Discourse of a Peace with the Turks continues; The Senate have sent Powers to their Ambassador at Vienna to Treat about it. The Convoy for the Levant is ready to Sail under the Command of Signior Francisco Moro, who is appointed Governor of Napoli di Malvasia. We have Advice from Tunis, That 4 of the Men of War belonging to that Government sailed thence on the 16th past to joyn the Ottoman Fleet.

Our Advices from Dalmatia say, The Venetian Forces in those Parts have lately had several successful Rencounters with the Turks.

Warsaw, June 20. The Baron of Hoyerbeck being lately arrived here as Envoy from the Elector of Brandenburg, has had a private Audience of the King of Poland: He comes to renew the Antient Alliance between the Crown of Poland and the Elector of Brandenburg. Prince Sapieha, Great Marshal of Lithuania, arrived here yesterday, being accompanied by a great number of the Gentlemen of that Dutchy, and is to wait upon the King this Evening. The Sieur Oginsky is likewise shortly expected, with some of the Chief of his Party, so that it is hoped, an end will be put to the Differences which have of late given so much disturbance to that Country. The Envoy of Moldavia is to have his Audience next week. The Queen-Dowager having obtained leave to go for two years to Rome, intends in a short time to begin her Journey thither. The King's Forces continue their march to Russia, and Commissioners are sent to take care, that the Magazines on those Frontiers be sufficiently provided with all things necessary for their Subsistence. Our Letters from Lemberg say, The Tartars, who brought the last Convoy of Provisions to Caminieck, continue on that Frontier, where they commit great Ravages, and that one of their Parties having lately made an Excursion in those Parts, in which they got a considerable Booty, were in their Retreat fallen upon by some of our Troops, who killed divers of them, and put the rest to flight.

Vienna, June 18. The Prince of Lorraine, Bishop of Osnabrug and Olmutz, went hence the last week to Olmutz, intending after a few days stay at that place to pursue his Journey to Osnabrug. About Two thousand four hundred men of the Troops of Wirtemberg, who served in the Dutchy of Milan, are arrived in Austria, and will be forthwith sent to Hungary, to Recruit the Emperor's Forces. The Danish and Saxon Forces in Hungary are now marching to Poland, to joyn the rest of the German Forces in that King's Service. We have Advice from Prague, That the Czar arrived there the 16th instant in his way hither. Our Letters from Peter Waradin bring an Account, That the Bassa of Romelia, and the Bassa of the Arnauts, are come to Belgrade with between 7 and 8000 men, under their Command; That the Grand Signior is expected there in the beginning of July with the rest of the Army; And that the Vessels which the Turks design to make use

use of this Summer on the *Danube*, lie ready there, except 7 or 8 small Frigats which have their Station near *Vypalanka*.

Frankfort, June 29. The *Sieur Fuchs*, and the *Sieur Violet*, whom the *Electeur Palatine* had sent as his Commissioners to *Strasbourg*, to Demand the Records and other Publick Papers which the French had removed from *Heydelberg* during the War, are returned to this place, and have brought the same with them. General *Thungen* sent some days ago an Officer to the *Marquis d'Uxelles*, who Commands the French Forces in *Alsace*, to know when *Philipsbourg* and the other Towns on the *Rhine* shall be restored, and he has brought back for Answer, That all things were making ready in order to Evacuate those Places, and that they only stay for Orders from *France* to fix the time for doing it. We hear from the *Palatinate*, That they are at work to Rebuild *Heydelberg* and the other Cities of that *Electorate*, which were destroyed during the War. The *Electeur Palatine* is expected next week at *Weynheim*, and several Officers of his Courts of Justice, who lived here during the War, are gone to settle themselves in that City, which is appointed for their Residence.

Paris, June 30. The King has made Cardinal *Furstberg* a Present of 400000 Livres, and has restored to him the Pension he formerly allowed him of 24000 Crowns a year, which, with several others, had been suppressed during the latter end of the last War. Preparations are making for the Camp at *Compiègne*, which will consist in 25000 men, and will last about 3 weeks. We hear from *Brest*, That a Squadron of 10 Men of War is sitting out there, to Sail under the Command of the Count *d'Esrees* to the *Mediterranean*.

Brussels, July 2. The *Electeur of Bavaria* came hither yesterday from *Tervure*, to which place he returned the same Evening. His *Electoral Highness* designs to go to *Luxembourg* on the 6th instant, and great Preparations are making in that City for his Reception. The *Sieur Dyckvelt*, who has been here some time, is gone for a few days to *Namur*.

Hague, July 4. N. S. The States of *Holland* and *West-Friesland* are to meet here next Wednesday; and in the mean time the Matters they are to consider of have been Communicated to the several Cities of this Province, that they may fully instruct their Deputies upon them. General *Cosborne* is gone hence for *Bergenopzoom*, to give Directions about the new Fortifications that are to be made there. *Monsieur Cawitz*, Envoy from the *Electeur of Brandenburg*, has lately presented a Memorial to the States, touching the Arrears due to the *Brandenburg* Forces who were in their Service during the late War.

Plymouth, June 26. On the 24th instant put into this Port the King *William*, Benjamin Rouse Commander, from the *East-Indies*, bound for London. And this day arrived here the *Hannah* of *Biddisford*, laden with Sugar from the *Barbadoes*.

Bristol, June 27. Last Thursday came in here the *Diamond* and the *Sea-flower* Sloops from *Antegoa*; and this day the *Elizabeth* Galley of this

Port from *Virginia*, and the *Severne-Galley* from *Jamaica*.

Portsmouth, June 26. Last Friday came to Spit-head His Majesty's Ships the *Swiftsure* and *Jolly* Prize from *Plimouth*.
