

in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Barking which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint John, Becontree.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"All that part of the Parish of Barking, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the south by the middle of the River Thames and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east, upon the north, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of the River Thames due south of the southern end of the western boundary of the London County Council Becontree Estate, and extending thence northward to and along such estate boundary for a distance of 1 mile and 6 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Ripple Road, and extending thence first northward to and then westward along the middle of Ripple Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Gale Street, and extending thence northward along the middle of Gale Street, for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Gale Street across the Southend Branch Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 55 chains or thereabouts to the western boundary of the said London County Council Becontree Estate, and extending thence first southward and then south westward along such estate boundary for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Ripple Road, and extending thence first southward to and then eastward along the middle of Ripple Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Barking Bye Pass Road, and extending thence in a straight line due south for a distance of 1 mile and 50 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Thames."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Barking out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 1st June, 1934, at 1 o'clock for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th June, 1934, to Saturday, the 9th June, 1934, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or
