The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 15th day of May, 1934, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY, 15TH MAY, 1934.

Whereas it is expedient to make provision for the election by Congregation in special circumstances of persons between the ages of 70 and 75 as members of University Boards: Now the University of Oxford, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:

1. In Statt. Tit. X. Section II. § 4. cl. 4 (Statuta, ed. 1933, p. 247, l. 22), after subclause (f) insert:

"(g) An election in Congregation conducted under the procedure laid down in sub-clause (c) hereof shall be deemed to be an election complying with the provisions of Statt. Tit. XII. Section 1. § 1. cl. 7.

(h) At an election in Congregation conducted under the procedure laid down in sub-clause (f) hereof, all electors whose voting papers are duly received by the Registrar shall be deemed to be present and voting for the purposes of the provisions of Statt. Tit. XII. Sect. 1. § 1. cl. 7."
