The following Statute made by the Governing Body of New College, Oxford, on the 2nd day of May, 1934, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO STATUTE III, 14, OF THE STATUTES OF NEW COLLEGE, OXFORD, APPROVED BY RESOLUTION OF THE WARDEN AND FELLOWS BY THE UNANIMOUS VOTE OF ALL THOSE PRESENT AND VOTING AT A MEETING SPECIALLY SUMMONED FOR THE PURPOSE, AND HELD CN MAY 2ND, 1934.

In Statute III, 14, of the College Statutes add at the end the following words:

"unless the Warden and Fellows at any Stated General Meeting shall have resolved that for a period not exceeding the ensuing twelve months four will suffice: Provided that the pernoctation of several such Fellows in turn during any period may, if so permitted by any Bylaw respecting the residence of Fellows, be treated as equivalent to the residence during that period of the same Fellow."

Notice is hereby given that the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners have made the following Regulations under the Order in Council of 22nd July, 1920:—

- 1. All female candidates for any established situation in any of His Majesty's Civil establishments shall be unmarried or widows.
- 2.—(a) Women appointed to or holding any established situation in any of His Majesty's Civil establishments shall be required to resign their appointments on marriage and to notify their marriage to the Head of their Department immediately on its taking place.
- (b) Women resigning on marriage after service of not less than six years prior to their marriage may, at the discretion of the Head of the Department and with the approval of the Treasury, be granted a gratuity of one month's pay for each complete year of established service, but not exceeding on the whole a maximum of twelve months' pay.
- 3. Provided that upon application by the woman concerned exception may be made to regulations 1 and 2 (a) above in a case where the Head of the Department, the Civil Service Commissioners and the Treasury (in the case of recruitment) and the Head of the Department and the Treasury (in the case of an officer already in an established position) are satisfied after joint consideration that the employment in the Public Service of a married woman is advisable in the light of her special qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department in which she is serving. Officers appointed or retained under this provision will not be eligible for marriage gratuity.
- 4. These regulations supersede the corresponding regulations which were published in the London Gazette of 26th August, 1921.
