MANSFIELD CORPORATION GAS.

(Application for Special Order under the Gas
Undertakings Acts, 1920 and 1929.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Mansfield (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") whose address is the Town Hall, Mansfield, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 and 1929, for all or some of the following, amongst other, purposes (that is to say):—

1. To empower the Corporation to enter into and carry into effect contracts and agreements with reference to the purchase and taking by the Corporation of a supply of gas in bulk from The Grassmoor Company Limited of Grassmoor in the county of Derby and for the purposes of any such contract or agreement, within and without the limits of the Corporation for the supply of gas, to exercise the powers of the Gasworks Clauses Act 1847 with respect to the breaking up of streets for the purpose of laying pipes and to provide that the consent of the highway authority shall be required to such breaking up outside the said limits but that such consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. The parishes outside the said limits through which it is intended so to break up streets are the parishes of Glapwell and Ault Hucknall in the rural district of Blackwell and the parishes of Heath, North Wingfield, Temple Norman-ton and Hasland in the rural district of Chesterfield in the county of Derby.

2. To empower the Corporation to give by agreement within their limits for the supply of gas a separate supply of gas for industrial purposes only on the conditions and subject to the restrictions set forth in the Order, and to provide that the Secretary of State for

the Home Department may make regulations under which such a supply may be given.

3. To authorise the Corporation to purchase or take on lease showrooms and other buildings for the purposes of their gas undertaking, and to erect, fit up, maintain and let any such buildings.

4. To make special provision, where the Corporation's limits of supply for gas are bounded by or abut upon any street or part of a street situate outside those limits, as to the supply of gas by the Corporation to premises abutting upon such street or part of a street, and as to the breaking up of streets for the purposes of affording such supply.

5. To confer further powers upon the Corporation in regard to their gas undertaking and amongst other things, to extend the power of the Corporation to enter premises for the inspection of gas apparatus and for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of gas consumed or supplied; to compel gas consumers to repair gas apparatus in cases of danger; to empower the Corporation to cut off supplies where charges for gas &c. are not wholly paid; to empower the Corporation to prevent the improper use of gas; to make provision as to the inspection and testing of meters; to provide for the removal of fittings where a gas supply is discontinued; to enable the Corporation to levy and recover charges for special readings of meters; and to make provision as to the mode of service of demand notes.

6. To authorise the Corporation to borrow money for any of the purposes of the Order, and for the payment of the costs and expenses of and connected with the Order.

7. To enable the Corporation to exercise all such powers as may be necessary or convenient for giving effect to the purposes of the Order, and to confer upon them all such other powers as are now usually conferred upon local authorities in connection with the supply of gas.

8. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the Order and to confer other rights, powers and privileges.

9. To incorporate with the Order with or without amendment or modification all or any of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, and the Acts amending those Acts respectively; and to alter, amend, repeal or re-enact and extend to the Order (with or without modification) all or some of the provisions of the Mansfield Gas Act, 1852, the Mansfield Commissioners' Gas Act, 1878, the Order relating to the Improvement Act District of Mansfield dated the fifth day of March, 1885, the Mansfield Corporation Act, 1901, the Mansfield Corporation Gas Order, 1924, and the Mansfield Corporation Act, 1925, which relate to the Corporation's gas undertaking, and of any other Act or Order relating to the Corporation or their gas undertaking.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 27th day of July, 1934.
